From the Archives: Last year Joan Marshall drew my attention to several old vestments stored in one of the sacristy bedrooms. Most were in poor condition and beginning to show signs of neglect; none had been used by the parish for many years. Two of the chasubles appeared to be much older than the rest and, despite being stored in a plastic bag, were in reasonable condition. It had been suggested that some of the embroidery on one of these chasubles contained gold thread. With Fr Sony's permission, I took all the vestments to Mr Joe Reed, assistant archivist at Stonyhurst College. He was extremely interested in the two older chasubles and offered to analyse them and investigate their age and origin. He discovered that they date back to (c.1650-1750) and are made of rose floral brocade in a fiddleback shape. One with embroidered orphreys in various fruits and foliage, unknown place of production but probably made within our parish. The set includes stole and maniple, all with silver woven lace. The other with raspberry coloured imported French dress satin silk orphreys, includes stole, maniple and burse, all with white silk woven lace; again, probably made within the parish during the time when being a Catholic in England was very dangerous.

Where are they now? One of the fiddleback chasubles is currently on display in the Chapel Museum at the college and will rotate with the other after a couple of months. The vestments are now in wonderful condition and represent a rare example of early English Catholic church heritage; in short, they are irreplaceable. The college invited members of our PPC to visit the museum last week and we were all delighted to see the 'Hill Chapel St Francis' collection displayed in such an appropriate, environmentally controlled setting within an historic Catholic institution.
