Interpretation of church fathers on the gospel passage of 34th Sunday. John.18:33 – 37

THE TITLE OF KING IS ONE OF JESUS' MANY NAMES. St. GREGORY OF NAZIANZUS:

From the Archives

You may recall an article I included in one of last month's bulletins about Liverpool Metropolitan R.C. Cathedral, Christ The King. At the request of one of our parishioners, and on the feast of Christ the King, I turn this week to the history of our own Lancaster Cathedral and diocese.

Until the passing of the Roman Catholic Relief Act in 1791 Lancaster's Roman Catholics met in a makeshift chapel in St Leonardsgate. Building the first Catholic church in the town began with the laying of the foundation stone for the Lancaster Catholic Mission in Dalton Square on 13 March 1798. The chapel was consecrated during the following year, but, by the middle of the 19th century, there was a need for a larger church. Land for this was purchased on a different site near to the mission church, and the parish church dedicated to Saint Peter was built. It was a parish church until 1924, when it was elevated to the status of a cathedral when the Diocese of Lancaster was founded to oversee the Catholic population of Lancashire,

Cumberland and Westmorland (now Cumbria). The southern regions were formally part of the Diocese of Liverpool, while the northern belonged to the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle. The impressive size and relative grandeur of St Peter's Church lent itself to its new role as a Cathedral, with only minor changes required

The Bishops of Lancaster have included: Bishop Thomas Pearson (1924-1938), Bishop T.E. Flynn (1939-1961), Bishop Brian Foley (1961-1985), Bishop John Brewer (1985-2000), Bishop Patrick O'Donoghue (2001-2008), Bishop Michael Campbell (2009- 2018), Bishop Paul Swarbrick (2018 - present). Bishop Swarbrick, hails from Garstang and he has celebrated mass at Hill Chapel on at least two occasions since he was ordained bishop. MB
