How well do you know the Ashdown Forest - Answers

You might need to refer to the OS Explorer map 135 Ashdown Forest.

For simplicity, the Ashdown Forest will be referred to as the Forest.

I must apologise in advance - some answers are open to discussion and I am sure some of you will send me corrections. The current boundary of the Forest is not shown on the OS map and there might be a few accidental mistakes!

- 1. What was the original purpose of the Forest?
 - Ans) A royal hunting park, to protect deer for hunting
- 2. Which century was the Forest first recorded for this use?
- Ans) 13th century as an enclosed park, but used in 11th century after Norman Conquest for hunting
- 3. What was the original type of boundary of the Forest and what was its length?
 - Ans) Ditch & bank called pale, 23 miles (38km) long
- 4. What was the original size of the Forest?
 - Ans) approx. 13956 acres (5648 hectares) enclosed by the pale
- 5. What is its size today?
 - Ans) approx. 5920 acres (2396 hectares)
- How many Gates are there to the Forest?Ans) originally 48 gates (excluding hatches)

Today 8 gates: Friars, Fishers, Chelwood, Greenwood, Highgate, Shepherd's Gate, Barnsgate & Pound Gate

- 7. How many named hills are within the Forest boundary?
 - Ans) 7 hills- Black, Bunkers, Camp, Church, Dodds, Jessops, Mardens hills (counted on OS Explorer map but there might be more!)
- 8. Who is responsible for the management of the Forest?
 - **Ans) Conservators**

9. What animals are commoners allowed to graze?

Ans) sheep, cattle, goats, geese, mill horses (NOT riding horses)

- 10. What is this right called? Ans) Pasturage
- 11. Name the breed of 3 different types of animals that help manage the heathland.

Ans) Hebridean sheep, Riggit Galloway cattle, Exmoor Ponies

- 12. Which is the only native deer found in the Forest? Ans) Roe deer
- 13. Name 3 other types of deer to be found in the Forest.

Ans) Fallow, Sika, Muntjac

- 14. Which 2 types of birds is the Forest renowned for? Ans) Nightjar, Dartford warbler
- 15. What is the speed limit across the Forest? Ans) 40mph
- 16. How many named car-parks are in the Forest?

 Ans) 32 named car park
- 17. Can anyone land by parachute in the Forest? Ans) No it against the bye-law
- 18. Is off-road cycling allowed?

 Ans) No it against the bye-law
- 19. Which bye-law covers the use of drones in the Forest? Ans) Bye-law 14
- 20. How many pubs are within the Forest boundary?

Ans: None within the current boundary. The following are on the edge of the Forest: Foresters Arms, Crow & Gate, Red Lion, The Hatch Inn, The Roebuck.
