Nannerch Church - In association with the Mothers Union and Nannerch VC Primary School, **'Six Experience Pentecost'** stations will be set up in church on May 19th. The Church is open daily and prayer materials are always available.

Mold Church - Guided prayer sessions will take place daily 6.00 pm - 7.00 pm. From 25^{th} May to 4^{th} June,

Pontblyddyn Church, Prayer Stations will be in place for a quiet time of prayer on Friday 26th May 10.30 a.m. – 12.30 p.m. The church will then open daily as usual – prayer stations will remain in place until 4th June.

Lianferres Church will be open for an hour from 10.15 a.m. on 28^{th} May and from 7.00 p.m. on 31^{st} May

Gwernaffield Church will be open for prayer from 7p.m. - 8pm on 30^{th} May and from 11 a.m. to 12 noon on 1^{st} June

Safe Registration Centres.

The North Wales Anti-Slavery Project is looking for suitable buildings which can be used to register rescued slaves. Our Church Keyholders were asked to contact us if they have a suitable building and are willing to commit to opening them at a moment's notice day or night.

Flintshire Debt Advice Service

We received a report from our MA Representative who has become involved with the Flintshire Debt Advice Service. One of our aims is to help this organisation by supplying volunteers to give advice for a few hours a week in their premises in Wrexham Street, Mold. The Debt Advice Centre are particularly seeking male volunteers to support their work.

Housing The Homeless.

The working group are making good progress. We are asking the Diocese to help us with this by buying a property which would house 4 single men and at the moment this idea seems to be viewed favourably by the Diocese. We will then rent that property from them. However in order to do this we need to set up a separate Charity which will be answerable to the MAC. The following decisions were made:

- The Trustees of this Charity will be appointed by the MAC.
- Each church in our MA will be asked to raise £150 towards the cost of setting the project up.

Buildings Group/Sub Committee. We agreed the Terms of Reference for this group and now ask every church to nominate one of their members to attend the Buildings Group Meetings which will share good practice and experience. It will also be the group which review applications for faculties.

Faculties for the following were approved:

- Cilcain to make space in their nave for wheelchairs by removing some pews and replacing with chairs.
- Gwernaffield to reconstruct the rear of the nave, removing some pews, relocating the font, providing a social space, improving disability access both to the church and the toilet area. The will also replace the lighting and redecorate.
- Nercwys To install kitchen facilities in the vestry and build a toilet behind the vestry which would be accessible from both inside and outside the church.

The licensing of the Revd Daniel Stroud to the MA Team with pastoral responsibility for Bro Famau, will take place on Sunday 4th June 3.30p.m.

This was the first meeting of the Mission Area Conference since the annual appointments were made at the MA Vestry, and we had quite a lot of new members. That fact together with the new structure of the Mission Area means that we are obviously in a period of some uncertainty as we all settle down to work together in a slightly different way.

The fact that we dealt with organisational and practical details alongside discussing our outreach projects both new and ongoing is encouraging.
