Parking

In recent issues of the Newsletter, we commented on the problems caused by parking of cars etc in the Parish's streets. You may have seen or heard that the Government is considering the banning of parking on pavements, as already is the case in London. We recognise that many of our roads are very narrow and not really designed for today's traffic.

Fly Tipping

Some residents are still leaving items outside their property for the refuse collectors to take, which the operators either judge to be unsuitable or are <u>not allowed</u> to take. If an item is left after a collection, it means that it is the responsibility of the householder to dispose of it (legally) themselves.
