

# KIRKBY MALZEARD AND DISTRICT FLOWER AND PRODUCE SHOW

Saturday 2nd September 2017

1.30pm – 4.30pm

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## RULES

1. Entries shall be open to amateurs within a 3-mile radius of the Mechanics Institute, Kirkby Malzeard and also includes the entire Parish of Dallowgill.
2. Entries must be made/grown by the exhibitor. Pot plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for six months.
3. Entries close on Saturday, August 19th at 9.00pm. Late entries will not be accepted. Entry fees must be enclosed.
4. Entries must be staged by 9.30am and the Hall will be closed for judging by 9.45am on the morning of the Show.
5. The Secretary will issue numbered staging cards on the day of the Show. These must be placed alongside the entry.
6. Exhibits must remain in place until 4pm. Fifteen minutes will be allowed for clearing. Anything left after that time will be presumed for auction.
7. All names on pictures, ceramic plates, etc. must be covered for judging purposes. Where labels are necessary these must be plain.
8. Where size limits apply, these will be strictly enforced and exhibits outside these limits will be disqualified. Attention of exhibitors, stewards and judges is specifically drawn to this rule.
9. More than one exhibit per class is allowed, but for points purposes for a trophy only the highest award will count. Points are awarded 3 for First, 2 for Second and 1 for Third prizes.
10. Prizes will be awarded at the judge's discretion.
11. Exhibits must not previously have been shown at this Show
12. Any technical objection must be made in writing and taken to the Committee Room by 3.00pm on the day of the Show.
13. Prize cards must remain in place and prize money will be given from 1.30pm on the day of the Show. The exhibitor may detach the counterfoils.
14. The Committee, whilst taking every care, cannot be held responsible for exhibits and containers.

## **SECTION ONE – VEGETABLES Entry 30p per class**

### **Class 1 TOP TRAY AWARD**

**Prizes** 1<sup>st</sup> £10.00 2<sup>nd</sup> £5.00 3<sup>rd</sup> £3.00

### **RULES FOR VEGETABLES TOP TRAY AWARD**

a) The **Top Tray Award** in this class is for display of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight. The quantity of each type of vegetable required for display is given in brackets; Carrots (3), Cauliflower (2), Onions (3), Parsnips (3), Peas (6), Potatoes (3), Runner Beans (6), Tomatoes (6). Each individual type of vegetable will be judged to a total of 20 points, split into three as follows; 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect.

b) The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 18in. by 24ins. without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 18in. by 24in. can be used to display the vegetables or the area can simply be marked on the staging. When a tray has a lip or edge it must not exceed 18in. by 24in.

c) A black cloth is permitted and the tray may be painted. Parsley is permitted for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories (plates, sand, rings etc) will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia.

**Notes for exhibitors and judges:** Carrots and turnips must have foliage trimmed back to 3in. Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces.

### **Class 32 TOP VASE AWARD**

**Prizes** – 1<sup>st</sup>£10.00 2<sup>nd</sup> £5.00 3<sup>rd</sup>£3.00

### **RULES FOR FLOWERS TOP VASE AWARD**

- a) The **Top Vase Award** in this class is for a mixed vase of flowers containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plant. Please note that it is for different kinds of flowers, not two varieties of the same kind.
- b) The display will be judged out of a total of 35 points, split into 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the plants in the vase. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the blooms should be to normal Horticultural Society Rules.
- c) Plants used in the display should be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries are allowed.
- d) The vase can be any shape and size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.
- e) No accessories whatsoever – such as bows and additional foliage – will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to the stem, will be allowed. Packing material, including oasis, is allowed to keep the stems in place.

### **Notes for exhibitors and judges:**

- \*A vase, by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
- \* The Top Vase is open to anyone to enter and is not intended purely for growers who regularly display single species classes at shows.
- \* Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Vase class, bearing in mind that the entries may not come from regular exhibitors.
- \* Judges should note that the display has to be viewed all round.
- \* The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.
- \* Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules must be referred to, and will be decided by, the Show Officials.
- \* Failure to abide by these rules will lead to disqualification.

### **Set recipe for Class 83 – Date and walnut tea loaf**

**Ingredients:** 200g chopped dates  
1 tea spoon of bicarbonate of soda  
100g butter (diced)  
280g SR flour  
Pinch salt

50g chopped walnuts  
100g dark brown sugar  
1 egg beaten  
2 table spoons of Demerara sugar

**Method:** Mix dates and bicarbonate of soda with a pinch of salt. Add 300ml hot water, stir and leave to cool. Heat oven to 180 degrees C/gas 4/fan 160 C. Grease and line 2 pound tin. Rub butter into flour. Stir in walnuts and brown sugar. Add flour mixture and egg to date mixture. Beat well and pour mixture into the tin. Sprinkle top with Demerara sugar. Cook for 1-1.25 hours. Cool in tin for 5 minutes and allow to stand for 1-2 days.

### **Set recipe for Class 92 – 4 ginger snaps**

**Ingredients:** 200g SR flour, pinch salt, 1 tea spoon ground ginger, 100g caster sugar, 85g margarine, 100g syrup, 1 egg beaten.

**Method:** Mix dry ingredients and warm margarine and syrup. Add dry ingredients and beaten egg alternately to syrup and margarine. Place single tea spoonfuls on baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven 180 degrees C/gas 4/ fan 160 C for 15 minutes. Choose best 4 ginger snaps.
