Dear Friends,

"It's not fair!"

The complaint is a common one amongst children, even from a very early age. And adults who are called on to correct the unfairness soon learn that that may be easier said than done.

Because fairness, very often, is in the eye of the beholder. What may seem fair from one point of view may seem very unfair from another. And what seems, to the outside observer, to be the fairest solution may leave both sides feeling hard-done-by.

So sometimes we just have to try to help children to learn and accept that 'unfairness' is a normal part of life. And yet even as adults that doesn't stop us thinking that life *should* be fair. Indeed, the idea of fairness (or the complaint that something is not fair) seems to lie behind almost every area of political debate.

The push for 'equality', for instance, is just another way of asking for fairness. And of course it sounds fine in principle, for who could be against fairness or equality (or 'justice', to use another similar term)? But the problem comes when you try to define in practice what you mean by it.

In fact, a world where nobody could complain of unfairness would be a remarkably boring world — because it would have to be a world where everyone was exactly the same. But the fact that we are all different, with different likes and dislikes, needs and abilities, means that it is *appropriate* to treat people differently, without that necessarily being unfair.

That doesn't mean, of course, that there aren't ways of treating people differently that really are wrong. But it does suggest that arguments based on 'fairness' or 'equality' or even 'justice' are not always as clear cut as we might suppose.

It also suggests that most of us should be less bothered than we often are with comparing ourselves to others, or trying to assert our rights.

Jesus told a story which most people still find quite shocking, because it suggests that even God does not treat people in a way which we might think fair. But the twist is that he is unfairly *generous*. No-one in the story gets less than they deserve — although that still leaves some feeling hard-done-by, because he has not been as generous to them as to others!

Perhaps we ought to remember that next time we are tempted to think "That's not fair!" Because ultimately what we all need is mercy, grace, generosity — not fairness. If God treated us in the way we really deserved there would be no hope. But he doesn't, and he calls us to show similar generosity to others.

It's not fair — but it is good news, the best there could possibly be.





LETTER FROM NEW ZEALAND The Treaty of Waitangi



I have recently realised that ever since I started writing these newsletters from New Zealand I have never talked about our nation's founding document. In these days when many nations do not have written constitutions, and thus where people are not always aware of the basis upon which their country exists, I thought you might like to read a little about how New Zealand came into being as a sovereign nation.

Of course, Captain Cook had a great deal to do with it. He was the English Naval Captain who carried out many voyages of discovery in the late 18th century. In 1770 he made his first voyage to the Pacific where he circumnavigated New Zealand and produced the earliest maps. He made two other journeys to this part of the world and there are traces of his presence here in almost every part of New Zealand. Indeed, even the suburb of Dunedin where we live, Abbotsford, may have been named by Captain Cook. The story goes that a sailor called Abbot slipped from his horse and fell into a small creek. The name was then given to the ford where this occurred – Abbot's Ford – well, whether this is true or not there are hundreds of much more definite evidences of the good Captain from Yorkshire in our country.

But it is not until 1840 after several years of trading, whaling and the beginnings of white settlement that the British Crown chose to make a treaty with the indigenous people of New Zealand, the Māori who have lived here for some centuries before Captain Cook "discovered" New Zealand.

I have chosen to write about this because it is so important to all New Zealanders but also because I believe it is a landmark treaty in global terms. Of course there are indigenous people in Australia, the Aborigines, and the native Indians of Canada and the USA but as far as I am aware, there is no similar treaty in those countries and I also believe that the way the Crown has tried to treat the Māori (not always successfully!) compares very favourably to those other nations.

The treaty, which is quite a short document, was signed by William Hobson Consul & Lieutenant Governor appointed by the Crown and also by all of the Māori chiefs in 1840 and this is now celebrated with a national holiday on February 6th. Thus our nation actually started as a nation on that date in 1840. Incidentally, Australia was not constituted as a nation until early in the 20th century. We also say that Australia is a country with deep convictions . . . a reference to the fact that hundreds of Britons were transported to Australia as punishment for sometimes quite trivial offences. We have no such history as a convict settlement.

Our country has not been without its troubles since the treaty, indeed, the Māori wars were fought since the signing and there were injustices done over the sale and purchase of land and these events are still being worked through. But the treaty has given a basis upon which justice can still be done to redress grievances over past years.

Now it is true that there are many treaties and covenants in existence in our world, none is perfect and all require that agreement of (at least) two parties who each agree to the terms of the treaty and to comply with whatever obligations the treaty imposes. But are you aware that there is a treaty which may involve you? This treaty is quite different in that it is entirely one sided. It is also universal and applies to everybody everywhere.

In Old Testament times God made agreements with His chosen people in which He agreed to protect them, provide them with a homeland and to be their God IF they would agree to obey His commands and laws. History shows that they failed dismally time and time again and were eventually taken captive and removed from their territory and that even now, when the State of Israel is a fact, it falls far short of the territory that God had promised to the Israelites of old.

But now God's treaty is quite different. It is set out John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." Have you joined this treaty? Do you expect to go to heaven when you die? Please don't ignore this, after all, suppose it is all true (as of course I believe it to be) what do you have to lose? But just think of what you have to gain.
