'Hold On....Love will See you Through'

As I write, I have just come back from my hour's exercise of the day in which I took a walk that led me up the hill from the valley and through the grounds of Doddington Place. When I reached the top of the hill, I stopped to look around me. It was a beautiful sunny morning, of which we have blessed with many recently, and it was a pleasure to drink in the fresh air and the soundscape devoid of the noise of human activity but full of the busy, creative, spring bustle, chirps and hum of nature. This morning my gaze was drawn to the trees all coming into full leaf, with the magnificent horse chestnuts proudly bearing their new candles. In the parkland the trees have sufficient space to grow fully to the shape they want to take and as I stood and studied them, I was filled with wonder at their sheer size.

I have always found something immensely comforting about nature that is bigger than me. I think it's a common experience. We are awed by the magnificence of mountains, by the unstoppable power of waterfalls, by the vastness of deserts, by the roar of the ocean. Perhaps it reminds us of our littleness, that there is something bigger and more powerful than we are.

At the present time, we are all too aware of something seemingly bigger and more powerful than we are. We are frightened by the Corona Virus pandemic. We are used to exercising a considerable degree of control over our worlds, but that illusion has been swept away and we are confused and scared because we are threatened by something that we cannot see, or hear, touch, taste or smell. Something we can only know by its devastating effects. Our world has become strange to us and we are confronted by loneliness and isolation, by sickness and death, and none of us is immune.

This is not an easy time for anyone, and I am not denying the reality of the pain and misery, nor the importance of sitting and allowing those feelings full reign. But for me, this is not where the story ends. For me, for Christians, for people of faith all over the world, there is something bigger than the Corona Virus. It is something we cannot see, or hear, touch, taste or smell. And it is something that we can only know by its amazing effects. It is the God who holds each of us individually and the whole of our world. We may not understand his ways, but love, which is his weapon of choice in this and every battle, can be seen everywhere we look. From the beauty of nature's continuing creation, to the kindness of neighbours, to the generosity of community action, to the heroic sacrifice of NHS staff, God's love will always find a way. And ultimately, there is no Corona Virus in the Kingdom of Heaven. In finishing, I would like to share with you my favourite Bible verse. It unfailingly soothes my anxieties and I hope it might do the same for you:

'For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.' Romans 8:38-39





VICTORY IN EUROPE

At 3pm on Tuesday 8 May 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill made a radio announcement that the war in Europe had come to an end, following Germany's surrender the day before.


Nature Notes

More **red kite** sightings over the last few weeks – including over our house at West End in Doddington, and over Down Court Cottages, where seven **buzzards** were also seen together.

We can't get out much at present, but there's lots to look for in the garden. Butterflies that are flying now include **peacock**, **small tortoiseshell**, **comma** and the lovely **orange-tip**. Look out for early season bees and also bee-flies – the brown, furry insects with long proboscises which they use to suck nectar as they hover in front of flowers. There are two species locally: the **large** or **dark-edged bee-fly** has a dark front edge to each wing, while the **dotted bee-fly** has dark spots scattered across each wing – the tricky thing is to catch one with its wings still so you can see the pattern!

There's loads of stuff on the web to help you enjoy and learn about wildlife while we are on lockdown. The Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland has launched its Garden Wildflower Hunt (https://bsbi.org/garden-wildflower-hunt). Meanwhile, my own employers, Plantlife, are running their Every Flower Counts survey (https://www.plantlife.org.uk/everyflowercounts/) — where you count the number of flowers in a square metre of lawn - from 23 to 31 May: leave your lawn unmown till then, and you can find out how much nectar your lawn is producing, and how many bees this will support.

If you are on Twitter, the Chris Packham has set up the Selfisolating Bird Club (https://twitter.com/SIBirdClub or go to Twitter and search for @SIBirdClub). And there's been a lot of love for dandelions on Twitter. With the reduction in routine management of parks and verges, dandelions and many other wild flowers have been having a field day, and people have taken the opportunity to watch and photograph the many species of insects that visit dandelion flowers. Something you can do, if you're really keen, is to learn to identify the dandelions in your area. Last month, I wrote about apomictic plants, which reproduce asexually and form large numbers of very similar species – in the case of dandelions, this is more than 200! If you are interested, search #Dandelionfest on Twitter – or just take time to look closely at dandelions and see how much they vary in leaf-shape, flower size, the colour underneath the outer petals, and the shape of 'ruff' under each flower.

Latest ones

- Extortion Scammers KCC Public Protection are warning of criminals trying to extort money from Kent residents via email. This spam campaign is sent out to thousands of email addresses that have been obtained from security breaches. The latest one refers to pornography.
- You receive a text from criminals claiming to be from NatWest bank
 You are told there has been a request to update your mobile telephone contact number
 The criminal asks you to click on a link in the text to update your number.
- You receive a telephone call.
 An automated voice claims to be from the Government coronavirus helpline.
 You are told the Government wants residents to wear a face mask.
 To purchase face masks you are told to press button 1.

Earlier ones

- Text messages offering "free passes" to Netflix for the period of isolation.
- Emails supposedly from the World Health Organisation offering a PDF containing advice on how to
- stay safe.
- Text messages claiming you've been caught leaving your house and must pay a fine.
- Fraudsters posing as healthcare workers and going door to door selling bogus home-testing kits.
- Text messages asking you to enter your postcode to apply for a Covid-19 relief payment from the Government.

Please DO NOT get anxious about any of this, if you have doubts about any emails you receive just delete them, without opening them.

What to do:

- Never respond to threats or demands.
- Do not click on any links, delete the email.
- If the email contains your current password change it immediately.
- Report to Citizens Advice Scams Action Service or telephone 0808 250 5050.
- Please warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.
