These modules are designed to familiarise you with pastoral ministry and the key skills needed in a parish or other pastoral setting. The language of faith is explored together with the biblical and catechetical framework to support pastoral ministry.

On progression to the second year, you will gain a deeper knowledge of key doctrines and a deeper understanding of pastoral ministry. Patterns of spiritual practice will be examined, as well as good practice in sacramental preparation, and Catholic teaching on contemporary social issues.

Teaching is varied throughout the day to include lectures, group work, seminars, sharing pastoral practice and prayer. One-to-one tutorials are offered to all students by the Director of EPS throughout the year, and by other tutors according to their availability.

Assessment per module consists of one essay, one oral presentation in class and log book reflecting on your own pastoral ministry.
