Hambridge has its first new postmistress in 22 years at the shop. Linda takes over from Gill. From 28th of Jan the new post office hours will be 10-4.30 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and on Saturday 10-1 (so closed Wednesday) Linda had never even worked in a shop before let alone run one, but decided to give up her career and take on the shop purely for the fact the village needed one. It's been a challenge and a really steep learning curve but after a year of no salary, living and breathing shop, stock, accounts etc. Linda says they are finally noticing the rewards (obviously not monetary © Linda added!) but to see people

meet up, pop in for a chat, giggle or have a point of contact for lost dogs, phones, bank cards or even to make Paul laugh it's been worth it.

Rec Trust (HWRC) Over 30 people attended a lively AGM of the Hambridge and Westport Recreation Trust. Tributes were paid to the late Stan Male, often referred to as Stan the Man, by the Rec Trust Committee. Stan made an enormous contribution to maintenance and building alterations. Roy Sanders has moved away and his contribution was also recognized. The committee has been expanded and there was a possibility of roles being shared to reduce the workload. Simon Denley has joined the core team as Vice Chair. A very open discussion covered many aspects of hall management, including cleaning, toilet renewal, flooring problems, car park resurfacing, disabled spaces, access procedures, hall letting and footpath access. Liz Martin, the long serving treasurer was poorly and unable to attend. Extracts from the accounts for 2017/18 (in rounded figures) showed a surplus of just under £4000. The skittles league contributed over £1000 (Jean and Paul), the 200 club \pm 500 (Sheila) with the bar contributing \pm 2000 (Mandy and team). The next committee meeting will be on March 4th. Resurfacing the car park is a major item, with the school and the Rec Trust committee all looking for the best solution. Having additional members on the committee may help to share the work of keeping our hall maintained and to its high standard. Big thanks to Sue, Liz and Mandy and all the Rec. Trust committee.

Additionally there are boundary changes and Sue Steel will be retiring as our District Councillor. Sue has made a huge contribution over the years. We will also have a new County Councillor replacing Adam Dance, as we will come under a different area. Parish Council information is displayed on the notice boards in Hambridge and Westport.

Village meeting places change over the years, and Liz Martin told us recently something of the history of the Village Hall. As far as I know there are at least three other community centers that have been important to village life. Perhaps you know of more. There was the Brewery Social Club, The Legion Hut and more recently I have heard details about a room in the glebe field behind the war memorial. It fell in to disuse about 1910 and may have been called The Big Room or Long Room. Do you know more about this? We have a collection of historic correspondence about this contained in the church records, and soon to be stored at Somerset County Records Office.

How do you feel about the village having additional street furniture?

There has been a proposal for a drinking fountain. If you think this is a good idea perhaps contact Kristina Pitts 01460 281148. The general feeling amongst the Parish Councillors is that they are not in favour of funding this unless of course there is considerable interest from the community. Perhaps a picnic table somewhere with the right permissions obtained. There is budget to replace the existing benches if required.
