Dog fouling - There have been a few complaints of dog fouling particularly on the Village Green near the Clump. It is so unpleasant to have children come home with dog poo over their shoes and clothes and of course there is always the possibility of disease. The dog warden has posted a few reminder notices, as it is quite a serious offence with heavy penalties.

Bumpy road - Westmoor Lane seems to be getting worse. There are loads of theories, mainly centering on the damage caused by the flooding. There is some concern that it might be closed, but the Parish Council are aware of the importance of the road as a main link for the village.

Cleaning the village - Why not adopt your local road sign? As the winter weather and mud worsens, a few volunteers currently clean the village signs, 30 mph, directions, road names and so on. If you have signs near you, why not clean them occasionally and share the chore. Be safe though!

Liz Martin, treasurer of the Recreation Trust provides this short history of the skittles league:

"In May 1975, Percy Harvey presented the Recreation Trust with a solid silver cup, valued at £250 a lot of money at that time, which he wished us to use in whatever way we could to raise money for our funds - his stipulation was that it was to be continually used and that it should be called the Avalon Cup. He lived at Earnshill Farm Cottage with his other sister and brother-in-law Bertie Adams - both well-known village families at the time and with relatives still living in the area.

At a Committee Meeting it was decided that we would run a skittles league, John Martin and Richard Pearce (committee members at the time) undertook to run this for us and they continued to do so for twenty years followed by Andy Spiers and Mike Johns and currently Paul and Jean Knight. Rules were drawn up and the League commenced in September 1975 comprising of sixteen teams playing on three alleys - The Clarence Inn (now known as The Old Barn Owl), The Lamb and Lion and Hambridge Brewery Social Club (now Chalons). The cup was used for the League Champions and a shield presented by Ind Coope for a knock-out competition. During the years many other cups have been donated in memory of village people for use by the League. We now have eight teams - four at the Lamb and Lion and four at The Duke of York, Shepton Beauchamp. The sad decline of public houses in the village and subsequent loss of alleys has affected all Skittles Leagues." It can be a struggle to keep it going but each year the skittles league raises several hundred important pounds for The Recreation Trust.

The Recreation Trust AGM is on the 3rd December at 8.00pm. Come along and perhaps join the committee and contribute to, or support the running of the hall and recreation field.

The Lamb and Lion -

It is most important that a process is in place to alert the Parish Council when footpaths need attention. For keeping them passable we can coordinate this at village level with Ken Winstone, our footpaths representative, while the Parish Council have ultimate responsibility.
