# Tame Valley Wetlands

#### A brief introduction

In 2012, the Tame Valley Wetlands Partnership was awarded funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to develop the Tame Valley Wetlands Landscape Partnership (TVWLP) Scheme – a large, landscape-scale scheme covering 95km² in North Warwickshire and south-east Staffordshire, with local people, the River Tame and the area's wealth of built and natural heritage at its heart.

During 2013, the TVWLP Scheme is in its development phase... getting ready to submit a comprehensive 'Landscape Conservation Action Plan' to HLF at the end of the year. This will describe what the scheme will achieve and how it will be done. The scheme will begin in mid 2014 and run for four years with approximately £2.4 million funding – £1.8 million of this from the Heritage Lottery Fund.

There are plans to convert the old football fields, next to the River Tame by the Kingsbury Church entrance to the park, to create a wetlands area to increase plant, animal & bird species.

Plans are also afoot to make the river more accessible by grading the river banks.

## Flood Defences

Work is continuing on the erection of flood barriers on the Bodymoor Heath side of the Water Park, probably for a few more months. For those whose access to the Bird Hides have been restricted, hopefully all the work should be finished by early 2014. Thereby allowing access to the Canal and the RSPB site at Middleton.
