History of Tamworth Sailing Club Celebrating 60 years in 2014



Tamworth Sailing Club is situated on the banks of a 45 acre lake within the picturesque Kingsbury Water Park. The club offers leisure activity for all ages, so there's something for everyone.

Sailing experience is not essential as there are courses for those that want active participation and comfortable clubhouse facilities for those happy to sit and watch.

Tamworth Sailing Club is a progressive and friendly club situated on the banks of a 45 acre lake within the picturesque Kingsbury Water Park. With members from 7 to 70+ the club offers leisure activity for all ages, there's something for everyone. Sailing experience is not essential as there are courses for those that want active participation and comfortable clubhouse facilities for those happy to sit and watch.

Members may sail either their own or club dinghies during daylight hours on any sailing day throughout the year. For the competitive dinghy sailor there are the regular weekend races, competing for a variety of trophies. For the more relaxed sailor there is social sailing; just for the fun of it, and they also have a thriving junior's club which runs on alternate

Saturdays through Spring and Summer into Autumn.

Whilst the main focus is small boat sailing and racing, there are also 'on shore' social events, ideal for family group participation. Their annual events include the Dinner Dance in March where the trophies are given out, the Laying Up Supper in November, and the ever popular children's Christmas party.

As a "self help" club all sailing members are assigned to a duty team and about three days per year the team, under the instruction of an Officer of the Day, control the races, provide safety boat cover, and run the galley. Members are also asked to give some time each year to a "work party" to help keep the club and grounds in good order. There are other rewarding opportunities to volunteer and many members choose to do so, including committee members providing governance and development for the club, and our excellent team of dinghy sailing and power boat instructors.

All sailing club members can obtain a pass from the Water Park Office, giving them free access to the Water Park at all times (it is usually £3.50 to get through the barrier). Note that they share the water with the Midland Hydroplane club, taking alternate days

Closure of Footpath between Church & Mill bridges

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984. SECTION 14

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH T29 KINGSBURY

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing Public Footpath T29 Kingsbury between the Old Kingsbury Road Bridge (aka Mill Bridge at Grid Ref: SP21541, 95687) and the footbridge by Kingsbury Church (aka Church Bridge Grid Ref SP21296,96121) to all traffic.

The closure is required to safely facilitate improvement works to the area


The Order will commence on 15 September 2014 and will last for a period of 6 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier

Access to and from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of footpath to be closed, if any, will be maintained where possible
