### Tame Valley Wetlands

The walk around the River Tame is now complete.



This has been constructed by the Tame Wetlands Trust. There is a grassed track from the Kingsbury village side of the river, from the Mill end entrance, through a

gate & follow the river to the Church end. Here you pass through a kissing gate; turn left & cross the bridge over the Tame. Then, another left turn along a hard surface path back to the Mill end entrance of the Water Park.
