Used Postage Stamps - British and Foreign



Autumn Lecture Barnsdale after Geoff by Nick Hamilton

The committee decided to have a special meeting, despite the withdrawal of the RHS financial support for a Regional Lecture. Nick Hamilton, son of the revered TV gardening celebrity Geoff Hamilton, was invited to speak about the garden at Barnsdale, in Rutland, which he developed with his late father.

When he inherited the eight acres 19 years ago Nick's policy was to develop them as a visitor attraction. Today, four full-time gardeners and two apprentices are employed, and 28,000 to 29,000 paying members of the public flock each year to see the 38 gardens linked by landscaped borders. Geoff's belief that his gardens should be achievable by anyone is sustained in the philosophy of his son, Nick. He spoke in detail with the help of many glorious photographs about Barnsdale, which is said to depress men because it gives women too many ideas about what they want done in their own gardens! Michael Leech, a past chairman of our society, proposed the vote of thanks. This was particularly appropriate as he was a former colleague and friend of Geoff Hamilton.

Since the meeting we have begun to ask if there would be sufficient interest to arrange a trip to Barnsdale, say, in August 2016. The idea would be to go by coach, probably at a weekend, and spend one or two nights in an hotel in the Oakham area. Please may I have your thoughts and reactions to this.
