



BARBARA BALL

It is with great sadness that we have heard of the death, on November 16th, of a very special lady, Barbara Ball, who was 93 years old. Immediately after WW2 she went to Germany for a few years as a member of the WRNS, returning to Eathorpe to look after her mother. Barbara then worked at the G.E.C. in Coventry until her retirement.

Barbara enjoyed village life, and was always willing to give a helping hand whenever possible She was a member of the local O.A.P. Association, and the Monday Club, and was Church Warden of St. John's Church, Wappenbury for many years. Barbara spent the last few years in a Care Home in Leamington, where she always

enjoyed hearing about life and friends in Eathorpe.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Although the Police have reported only a couple of incidents in our villages, there have been quite a lot of house break-ins reported in surrounding villages - notably Stoneleigh, Offchurch and Bubbenhall. Below are the incidents reported in the Police Newsletters:

Weston-under-Wetherley: Vehicle Crime: Between 0800hrs Saturday 21-OCT-2017 and 1615hrs Wednesday 25-OCT-2017 unknown offender(s) stole a black 'Y' reg Suzuki scooter from the side of a residential property in St. Michael's Close, Weston -under-Wetherley.

Eathorpe - Burglary: Between 1000hrs Thursday 09-NOV-2017 and 1320hrs Sunday 12-NOV-2017 unknown offender(s) burgled a residential property on The Old Fosse Way, Eathorpe. Offender(s) forced entry via a door to the rear of the property. A tidy search was conducted. No items are believed to have been stolen.

The Fosse Way, Eathorpe - Burglary: At some point before 1.30pm on 12 November, offenders broke into a rural home by forcing open the front door. Once inside, the offenders carried out an untidy search before making off with several items, including items of jewellery.

In addition to these, burglars also entered a property in Hunningham, but apparently made off without stealing any goods, as they were detected by a state of the art security system.

Finally for this month, I repeat the advice given by the Police entitled *Darker Nights*:

- set a timer switch to turn your lights on when it gets dark unlit houses are a give away that no-one is at home
- lock your doors, patios and downstairs windows even when you are in. Make sure you double check them again before you go to bed
- if you have a burglar alarm, make sure you set it when you go out, and also when you go to bed
- don't leave car keys, ID cards or valuables near windows, doors or letter boxes, where burglars can reach through and steal them
- lock your garden gates and side entrances. Don't leave tools lying around in the garden, which could be used to break in to your home

GREEN MATTERS

Having just spent a busy morning visiting the shops, doing some early Christmas shopping and enjoying the developing festive atmosphere, it may seem churlish to refer to some of the adverse impacts of the busiest retail season of the year. A recent documentary followed refuse collectors in Newcastle for several days on and around Christmas. Apart from demonstrating what a tough and thankless task this work is, it also brought home to me the enormous and largely hidden level of waste associated with the festive season. The waste operators face greatly increased rubbish levels at this time as we all buy more, dispose of more and recycle less. Some of this increase comes from the disposal of wrapping and packaging from presents (many of the 16 billion cards sent each year are not recycled) as well as people clearing out old toys and clothing to make way for the new items they have been given. Non-recyclable plastic waste also spirals at this time.

We all aim to eat well over Christmas and food wastage, which is always an issue, is far more dramatic at this time. The equivalent of 2M turkeys, 74M mince pies and 5M Xmas puddings are thrown away. 13,500 tonnes of glass are sent to landfill over Xmas largely from alcohol consumption – if these were all recycled it would save as much CO2 as removing 1300 cars from the road. It is understandable that we all want to be well stocked with good food for our family and friends at this time of the year but at a time when, even in the UK, many are struggling to feed their families, it must be possible to reduce this level of waste.

Christmas is hugely commercialised and we are encouraged to spend freely but it is worth remembering that some of the most treasured memories for children and adults do not need to be expensive. Children love the atmosphere and magical qualities of this time and the chance for their families to relax and play. Giving and sharing does not always have to mean buying things and sometimes even children can get overloaded with plastic toys – some of the best things in life really are free. No-one wants to be a "kill joy" and I have always loved Christmas but if we are all thoughtful about what we buy and how we dispose of it, we can play our part in reducing the environmental impact of the festivities. FARMER'S DIARY

It appears the robot technology I spoke of at Harvest festival is already out of date. The future is not just driver-less tractors but swarms of light footed robots working their way over the fields 24 hours a day. These little chaps can spot a target weed, selectively spray it and leave the crop unsprayed. A sort of organic system that's not organic if you see what I mean. They are developing robotic pickers to replace the Eastern Europeans who presently harvest most of our home grown fruit. In some crops, rather than pull the whole thing up and throw the unripe away, the robots will return and pick those at a later date. 23% of the present fruit crop is thrown away at the point of harvest.

DEFRA think this robotic technology is the way forward and that post Brexit we can feed everyone and prevent the appalling food miles needed to import all that produce we demand all year round. There is now a Countryside productivity grant available nudging us to be more efficient and increase output.

Much as I admire technology there is an art to farming and it is in danger of being replaced by science. I really enjoyed rolling a field at night to beat the imminent rain and doing so only because I could see what I was doing on a computer screen and all without hands on the wheel. However, this latest robot invasion created a rather melancholic mood as I recalled the corn and hay harvest tea breaks. Hot, tired and some gentle banter punctuating the summer air, with farm labour and holiday helpers sitting on small bales or even bags of rogued wild oats. Would you go back? I here you say. Of course not, but there is something very satisfying in a job well done, especially if it is accomplished by a large team. In "Far from the madding crowd", Gabriel struggles manfully to sheet up the crops before their certain ruin by an angry storm, Bathsheba helps and there develops a heart-warming bond. Modern life could be causing us to lose something very precious. Now the telescopic forklift does the lifting with only the Test match special team for company. The helpers we used to have sadly turned into annoying vandals as they let the grain out of parked up trailers, set fire to our straw and created "amusing" corn circles. The vandals have largely disappeared, to where I do not know.

As I look down from the hill to the wood I see 5 or 6 farms all cared for by friends and neighbours. The crops have established well. There is not a robot in sight. Only the patchwork of fields and hedges so unique to our countryside. There, not just by the use of science but by the age old art of the farmer.

The current situation

At the moment we print copies of the newsletter, and deliver them, to every household in the four villages. Printing currently costs us £150 per issue and we produce 10 issues per year. Thus our total costs are £1500 per year. The income we get from advertisements and donations is less than £600 per year.

It's obvious, then, that we have a financial problem! We estimate that we have enough funds to produce another 4 or 5 issues of the newsletter and then, if we do nothing, the newsletter will have to fold.

A way forward

Several people already receive the newsletter by email and have told us that they prefer it this way. At the moment, these people also receive a printed copy each month, which is wasteful, so we propose to stop doing this.

We also propose to ask those who DO wish to continue to receive a printed version to pay a small annual subscription of £5.

It may take a couple of months before we fully move to this new arrangement, which gives us chance to check that we have everybody's email addresses or postal addresses before switching completely to the new distribution means.
