

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

This is my first report for 2018, and I start with two incidents in Hunningham.

Firstly, potential thieves were again spotted in Main Street around the 3am time. This was the second time they had visited one of the properties, but the vigilant residents were alerted, and the thieves left empty handed. They then moved on to another property, but again, thankfully, to no avail.

For the second incident, please see below the police report:

"Theft from vehicle in Leigh Terrace, Hunningham

Please be aware that between 11.45am and 12noon on 14 January, offenders smashed the driver's side back window of a vehicle parked outside a home in Leigh Terrace, Hunningham and stole a handbag and contents."

As some Hunningham residents will know this second incident concerned my wife's car!! I have to say that her bag was barely visible tucked in on the floor beside the back door, but that, clearly, was not enough, and this brazen crime was committed unbelievably quickly by opportunistic thieves.

The most annoying issue for her is the loss of her diaries, so, if, by chance, you notice a large bag (beige with a turquoise blue lining) thrown away in a hedge, or anywhere by the road, please let us know

CHURCH NEWS: PASTORAL LETTER

ON THE MOVE

By the time you read this, Hunningham Vicarage will be inhabited once again. And while I think about it, very soon it will be PUPPETS & PANCAKES in St Margaret's Church, Hunningham, on Sunday 11th February at 4.00pm as we reach that springtime season of Lent, running up to Easter. The year really is on the Move! But at this moment, I want you to reach out to Carole and me, as we get caught up in the business of moving house. It is an awful time, isn't it? Packing up, everything in transition and all the 'changes of circumstance' that have to be reported. But I know, deep down, that this is a time of opportunity for us, a time to re-construct our daily life; a chance to take stock AND DE-CLUTTER.

As my wife and I move into your rural community, we have the chance to embrace something different. And underlying that is this truth that, contrary to the rampant individualism that our post-modern world is so hooked into, we can take part in what it means to live life together. 

The website is slowly evolving, being updated and is a work in progress.



WESTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

TELEPHONE BOX

In February 2012, the previous Parish Council discussed adoption of the Telephone box and voted unanimously against doing so as they would have to pay for ongoing maintenance. In December 2017, WDC were contacted by British Telecom requesting permission to remove the unused Telephone Box. WDC did not consult with the Parish Council or villagers before agreeing to this removal. Jane Chatterton, Parish Clerk & RFO canvassed the views of Villagers via Facebook and email with 27 villagers wanting reinstatement and 3 against. British Telecom were asked to reinstate the Telephone Box K6 Kiosk then issuing the Parish Council with a quotation for this work totalling £2,022. The Parish Council did discuss to what purpose the Telephone Box could be used. For example, were a second defibrillator to be installed, the south porch at St. Michael's Church would be a suitable location. Considering the costs involved and our limited financial resources the Parish Council has decided unanimously not to proceed with reinstatement of the telephone box.

RUGBY ROAD FOOTPATH FROM BRAMLEY COTTAGE TO ST. MICHAEL'S CLOSE

The Parish Council has attempted to contact the owners of the field north of Rugby Road at the rear of Bramley Cottage running up to St. Michael's Close, asking for remedial works to prevent field and hedge slippage into the footpath. We have had no response to telephone messages or correspondence. Cllr. Wallace Redford will be contacting the Solicitor at Warwick County Council to request enforcement and to consider a charge on the property for works to be carried out.

RUGBY ROAD FOOTPATH ADJACENT WESTON HOUSE, THE FORMER BULL PH

A regular dog walker reported the hedge encroaching onto the footpath from the former Bull Public House. The Parish Clerk is writing to the Land Agent to ask for the hedge to be trimmed as access is becoming restricted on the footpath.
