HAPPY 100th BIRTHDAY TO BOB!



Bob Robinson has lived in Wappenbury since 1964 and celebrated his 100th birthday on 15th September 2016, although he says 'there's nothing to celebrate in getting older'! Bob worked on farms all his life, following in his father's footsteps. He moved from Scotforth near Lancaster with his family in 1928 to Staffordshire, then got his first job as farm manager to shipping heir Lady Rosamund Mary Harrison, in Maer. He remembers Maer

Hall, run by a large staff of maids, cooks, the butler and footmen as well as the farm manager, shepherds and herdsmen at the farm. Lady Rosamund had a back room called the Beggars' Hall, which filled up every morning with 40 poverty stricken people, who all left with £5 as well as having a good breakfast.

Bob and his wife Connie made the move further south in 1964 when he applied for a job as farm manager in Warwickshire. His previous employer put in a good word for him and told Bob: 'Sir William Lyons wants to see you at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning'. Sir William was so impressed with Bob that he put off the man he had already hired and offered him the job on the spot.

Bob met his wife Constance during his days at Maer. He and his dad needed a poultry worker, and Connie got the job. They were married for 75 years, but Connie sadly missed her husband's 100th birthday by only a few months. She was taken ill earlier this year and passed away in July.

Bob misses Connie every day, he says she was one in a million.



They were both prize winners in their day, Connie showing Chihuahua dogs and judging at Crufts in 1986, and Bob winning at the Royal Cardiff Show in 1938 with his bull Townend Supreme. His Jersey cattle and Suffolk sheep won prizes all

over the country, and Bob was a judge of sheep at the Royal Show when it came to Stoneleigh from 1963. Katie Alcock & Rachel Commander

The developer is appealing Warwick District Council's decision to refuse the planning application for demolition of the former Public House and the erection of three detached dwellings. The site already has permission for a change of use from a Public House to a letting agency. To see the detailed

FARMER'S DIARY

FOOD OR FLOWERS? A lot of water has flowed under Hunningham bridge since the last time I wrote in these pages. Now the harvest is safely gathered in it is time to reflect on the situation post 'Brexit'. The relative calm of this year's harvest with its winners and losers seems to be reflected in the political world. We do not yet know where the future Agricultural Policy lies but the pressure is already on with the latest State of Nature report laying the blame for any decline in species squarely at the farmhouse door. But never do they mention the saving of the Cirl Bunting

by 130 farmers in the South Hams or the replanting of 30,000 km of hedgerows recently, accompanied by pollen - nectar mix planting. Increases in bat and barn owl populations and the return to more spring cropping. That and the use of no-plough techniques



on this farm has seen a dramatic increase in the Brown Hare and Dunnocks



around the Leam Valley.

But we still need to produce food in an environmentally friendly way and with the highest level of welfare for our stock. If we do not then other countries with

dubious environmental methods and standards of welfare will supply the growing population. Commonsense is urgently needed.

The imbalance between the E.U. and the U.K. in terms of imports and exports must be addressed and a new deal with our Antipodean and American and Canadian friends realised. It's time to open the door to the opportunity that knocks in these challenging times.

Perhaps the increasing demand for 'glamping' will be such an opportunity

for the peaceful Leam Valley, it remains to be seen whether that serenity is broken by the ever closer threat of H.S.2.

WEATHER



August started somewhat unsettled with low pressure in charge although there were plenty of dry and sunny days. The second half of the month was much more settled. At the end of the month it got a bit breezy from the South which brought very warm and humid weather from Europe. This was an extremely varied month. Overall it was

much warmer than average and very close to the warmest August in my records. Rainfall was near average but only due to one spell of torrential rain near the end of the month which raised the levels after a quite dry spell.

There were 10 days of measureable which were not too exceptional but on the 27th we had a torrential downpour which gave us/me 25.5mm. I have not seen rain like that for some time and I was glad that I was indoors and engrossed in the Rugby League Challenge Cup final. An excellent game by the way....

The warmest day was the 23rd with 30.5C and the lowest daytime maximum was 20.5C on the 20th. Such a change within 3 days!
