High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are now underway in your area, carried out by LM – a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and J. Murphy & Sons.

LM will be creating an archaeology site at Crewe Farm off Crewe Lane in Kenilworth from mid-August 2019. For around 2–3 months, we will be working within one field.

We're recording any findings ahead of HS2

Experienced and qualified archaeologists will record any historic artefacts in an area near the HS2 route. They will access the site using existing access points. A small compound will assist the team.



You may see us at work

The team will use equipment to clear top soil, before digging by hand and recording any findings. Special machinery will stop dust, protect soil and make sure nearby woodlands are not impacted. At the end of our dig, we will fully reinstate the site, returning it to its original state.

We'll be working at Crewe Farm from mid-August until mid-November 2019. We may finish our work earlier than November, depending on weather and site conditions.
