#### 5. Bus issues

A - Update on First Bus services and b - Hopper /Plum line

There was much disquiet over the changes to the First services due to take effect from September 16<sup>th</sup> 2018. The villages particularly affected were Fladbury, Cropthorne, Charlton, Wyre Piddle, Eckington, Norton, Littleworth as well as others to a varying degree. Letters had been written to a number of county councillors as well as officials. These had been met with silence with no offer to meet. Further correspondence would be sent to the two local MPs. It was hoped that

press coverage would also put pressure on the CC. Emergency funding on an interim basis was discussed. The possibility of alternate day services was also discussed.

Discussion took place over the potential involvement of the Hopper as well as the Plumline. It was agreed an urgent meeting of the bus group would take place to go over in particular, suggestions from Colin Tether and John Bolt. This was scheduled for August 23<sup>rd</sup>. The hub arrangement would be considered at this meeting – Pershore, Evesham and Worcester. Connections with the X50 were essential as was improvement in bus/rail links, including to Parkway when operational. Extension of First 32 from Worcester to Norton/Littleworth was also discussed as a possibility in relation to those villages near Worcester.

## 6. Train issues

Limited discussion took place on rail issues due to time. There was no news to report on the Pershore Station issue. Staffing and faculties remained problematic.
