#### Lead theft from churches and what you can do to help prevent it here

There have been a number of serious lead thefts from churches local to us recently. Your help in keeping a watchful eye for suspicious activity is much appreciated. Please note vehicle numbers and alert the police if you see anything suspicious. Thieves often remove a small amount of metal at a time, making repeat visits to clear the site. Alerting police may help them identify and catch criminals. Please call the police if you see vans or workmen around the building outside normal working hours. Please be extra watchful when works are going on, as buildings are attractive to thieves if there are workers or scaffolding on site.

#### Home security Advice

Recent Police reports received have highlighted a slight increase in outbuilding and shed being broken into in rural areas around Bassingbourn Village.

The Neighbourhood Policing Team would like to take this opportunity to offer some security advice to assist residents in keeping their personal items safe and secure were possible; Garages and shed are often full of expensive tools, which are ideal for breaking into your homes.

Never leave any outbuildings unlocked, especially if it is a connecting door to the home, whereby a burglar can get in and not be seen.

Fit additional strong locks/ padlocks and make sure doors are strong enough not to be kicked in. ensure any ladders are locked away and not left lying around or down the side of the main home. Ensure brackets are internal and not exposed bolts or screws that can easily be undone. Consider use of a steel box fitted to the floor of to secure larger tools.

Side gates and excess points are locked and secured. Boundaries of your property have strong fences or plant some thorny hedges to the front, (but don't let them grow too high 1-1.5mtr in height) so passers-by can see the front of your home but not inside your property.

Alarms are useful and more residents seem to be installing these alongside CCTV cameras, most new ones can be viewed on your mobile devices.

#### **NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL**

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (Village Hall in winter) at 7.30pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

Discussion on agenda items from Parish Council Meeting on Monday March 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Report from County Cllr Sebastian Kindersley:

As CIIr Kindersley could not attend the meeting he had sent his report in advance so it was not discussed at the meeting and was taken as read. Items included:

- EWRail consultation is now closed. There had been little support for the EWR proposals at the public consultations yet the alternative route following the A428 suggested by CamBedRailRoad had been well supported
- An Ofsted of CCC children's services had rated the service as "requires improvement" a drop from "good" in the past five years. This is obviously a result of increased cuts to services and the higher number of children being placed in care in Cambridgeshire.
- There was a disappointing outcome to the latest meeting with Hertfordshire about the A505. It was agreed money could be found from the road safety budget to ban right turns from the Litlington junction (highest record of accidents with injuries) and this will happen in the next five years. However funding is not available for any changes to other junctions and they will be added to a list where it is unlikely they will receive funding within the next ten years. Cllr Kindersley suggested that at least a 50mph speed limited be introduced past the Odsey junction. The PC will respond to Hertfordshire supporting this proposal.

#### **Report from District Cllr Heather Williams**

- IT problems are still on-going creating problems with sending out newsletters by email.
- The chief executive at SCDC Beverley Agass has taken sudden early retirement. In the last 10 months over 50 people have left and there are currently over 60 vacancies. Cllr Williams couldn't make any comment on the situation other than report the facts.
- Cllr Williams did not vote for the budget at the last full council meeting as she did not agree with the extent of the cuts/savings proposed, or with a proposal to borrow £20m for investment over the next five years. She had proposed an amendment for there to be more transparency which was voted down. The PC would request information about the criteria and rate of return for this investment.
- Charge for an extra green bin The charge would be £20 from 1<sup>st</sup> April until October or for any period during this time so advice was to sign up now to take advantage of this. The next payment would be due in October.

#### Matters Arising from last meeting

- A decision about the re-nomination of ACV for the Waggon & Horses would be made on 9<sup>th</sup> April
- A quote was still being sort for a new website host. The website appears to be unavailable at present.
- Costs for street lighting energy will be investigated for the 2020 budget.

#### Financial Report.

• The budget and the purchase of a new printer were approved.

#### **Recreation Ground**

- David Holt's name will be added as a key holder for the car park gate and the sign will be changed.
- A new dog sign was being be put up.
- The gun dog training was taking place on the conservation area which was having a detrimental effect and they will be asked to move back up to the recreation ground.
- A new surface for the car park had been ordered.
- The work on the leylandii trees was now scheduled for October and all parties are in communication.

#### Maintenance

- Footpath 10 the sign needs to be changed to agree with the definitive route.
- It was confirmed that Black Lane is County Council owned.

#### Traffic

- The signs will be erected on a lamppost in Station Road
- A coordinator and volunteers are still required for the speed watch team. The parish clerk would be the contact.

#### Litter pick

• A new season of litter picking has started with a successful first session at Odsey which resulted in 18 bags of litter being collected. Refreshments were provided afterwards at the Jester

#### Planning

- Planning Ref S/0412/19/FL North Brook End Farm, provision of indoor training facility, equestrian building and further staff accommodation. Supported with a covenant that the accommodation was for employees of the business only
- Planning Ref S/0569/19/FL 77 Hay Street, single story extension to rear. Supported
- Planning Ref S/0250/19/FL Morden Grange, erection of kiosk. Supported

#### Car Parking at Station

It was agreed that parking at the station is an increasing problem with a greater volume of cars often
parked dangerously and this is a problem that is likely to continue and increase. Various options for a
solution have been explored in the past but it was felt the situation warrants further attention. Cllr
Courtney had prepared a comprehensive document looking at the problem with recommendations for
action. He was thanked for his efforts and it was agreed a working party consisting of Cllr Traverse
Healy, Cllr Courtney and Cllr Belson would meet to consider options available.

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

- This will be held on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> May and will be preceded by the AGM.
- Village groups can only give a report if they physically attend the meeting.

Keith Austin reported that the village hall committee now had a new secretary, Mike Smith

## **SPEED WATCH**



My name is Phil Priestley and I am a Sergeant with the Neighbourhood Policing Team. I'm based at Parkside police station and my activities are focused on building community partnerships and helping to reinforce the policing presence that is available to all of our communities through Active Citizenship.

A big initiative that has been very successful across Cambridgeshire is 'Speed Watch' – and I know that Steeple Morden felt the benefit of this work for quite a while before it was withdrawn. There is a fantastic group of very active and socially conscious people in Steeple Morden who are

rightfully concerned about road safety. The volume of traffic across the county has risen in recent years – and with that you will notice more drivers who are guilty of using their phones behind the wheel, speeding, driving too close to cyclists – perhaps even driving erratically through drink. If the number of cars on the roads increases – unfortunately the number of driving offences will rise in parity to that increase. We want to keep people safe.

Steeple Morden is investing in road safety and I am very impressed with the long term planning that is being organised by Cllr Jeremy Clayton and the rest of your Parish Council. They are exploring technology that will passively record the volume and speed of traffic on the road, and will offer a visual deterrent to speeding motorists.

In the longer term I will work with the Parish Council to explore buffer speed zones, the options for chicanes and gateways, and other planning options.

Additionally the Speed Watch group is being re-launched and re-invigorated – and I am determined to support it in every way that I can. They will record data on speeding vehicles, they will work in plain sight and particularly I am asking them to help us identify the drivers who hit the highest speeds, and those drivers who speed with the most frequent disregard for the rules of the road. This means the fastest speeders, and those cars that break the speed limit most regularly (these might be two separate groups of people entirely).

Please don't make the mistake of thinking that your local Speed Watch group works for me. They work to keep you safe – and to protect the children of the village. They work for Steeple Morden as a community. I would ask you to support them in every positive way that you can.
