# Use of public rights of way

You can walk on public rights of way.

Some public rights of way are also open to horse riders, cyclists or motorists.

You can use:

- footpaths for walking, running, mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- bridleways for walking, horse riding, bicycles, mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- restricted byways for any transport without a motor and mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- byways open to all traffic for any kind of transport, including cars (but they're mainly used by walkers, cyclists and horse riders)

## Rights of way in England, Wales and Northern Ireland

Public rights of way are marked with signs or coloured arrows, for example yellow for footpaths, blue for bridleways.

You can find the route of public rights of way:

- on Ordnance Survey and other maps
- on some <u>council websites</u>

#### Report problems with a right of way

Report if you've had a problem using a right of way (such as an obstruction, poor maintenance or a misleading sign) to the:

- local access authority contact them through <u>the</u> <u>local council</u>
- <u>National Park Authority</u> if it's in a national park

#### Other don'ts for users of public rights of way

- You are not allowed to disturb or harm any wildlife found on a public right of way.
- You should not drop or leave litter on a public right of way.
- You should not trespass on neighbouring lands to public rights of way. At all times keep to the legal limits!

1. Planning Meeting 22<sup>nd</sup> November

#### **Planning Applications**

Planning S/3428/17/0L 1. Land to the west of Station Road between 12 and 14 Station Road (Steeplefield Ltd) Objection Planning S/3897/17/FL 2. Land North of Bogs Gap Lane - two new proposed dwellings (Ms Jayne Ewert-Perks) Objection Planning S/3619/17/FL 3. 3 Station Road – single storey rear extension to kitchen and dining room (Mrs Anna Pye) Recommended Planning S/3789/17/TC 4 5 Brook End - Tree Work (J Clayton) Recommended

A planning meeting was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> November at 20.00 hours to determine planning applications and other matters. Approximately 30 people were present.

**Planning Application 1** - was discussed and various objections were put forward from the floor - namely, that there would be a loss of privacy, outside the village envelope, environmental and lose of wildlife concerns, and extra traffic and parking problems on an already overcrowded road.

**Planning Application 2** - was discussed, this also was outside the village envelope, again loss of privacy, and concern that the driveways would be converging on an already busy and dangerous junction. There would be some loss of wildlife.

## 2. Committee Meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> December

- **District Cllr Cicely Murfitt** Cllr Murfitt reported that the Local Plan would not be completed until March 2018, and possibly would not be published until after the May elections.
- County Councillor Mr S Kindersley confirmed that the South Cambs Planning Committee were working on the Local Plan but had still not specified what supply of land would be available for building it still stands at 5,500 homes. (2006). (Local Plan and neighbourhood planning)
   www.scambs.gov.uk/content/planning). CCCC are facing cuts of 37.9million in the coming year. A meeting has been arranged to discuss the A505 and the A428 (Caxton Road) for future investment.
- **Recreation Ground and Conservation Area** Two signs will be erected one at the entrance of the recreation ground and one near the car park warning 'Children Playing'.
- **Footpaths-** several footways are becoming overgrown it should be noted if a householder's hedge or trees obstruct a footway it is the householders responsibility to rectify the matter. Footpaths are the responsibility of the CC council.
- Football Club have requested that the recreation ground grass is allowed to grow a little longer before cutting. (The Tennis Club would also be interested in having the grass a little longer in front of the courts, between the 'kissing gate' and the field hedge.)

#### Hoarding

Hoarding is a serious and complex issue that goes far beyond simple untidiness. It is a recognised mental health condition requiring careful treatment. Hoarding is a widespread issue affecting between 2% and 3% of the population - approximately 1.2 million people in the UK.

People who display hoarding behaviours excessively collect items such as newspapers, books, clothing, and in some cases rubbish, rotten food and animals, resulting in unmanageable amounts of clutter. This in turn can cause serious health problems, structural damage, pest infestations and serious risk of fire.

Since 2014, we have engaged with over 50 households in South Cambridgeshire alone. In more serious cases, it can sometimes lead to emotionally distressing enforced clearances. People who display hoarding behaviours need help to learn how to change the way they think about acquiring, purchasing, or collecting as well as how they relate to their belongings. 
