NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (the Village Hall in Winter) at 8.00pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

A copy of the full minutes from the Council Meetings may be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk, Sally Walmesley, Redwood Lodge, South Street, Litlington, Royston SG8 OQR. Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail <u>sally.walmesley@btinternet.com</u>. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website <u>www.steeplemoden.org</u> and the Village Post Office. Discussion on agenda items at the June meeting included the following:

- The PC still require the co-option of one additional Councillor.
- SMFC gave an update and made a request for several items: weed and fertilise the pitch agreed agreed with pre-warning signage, shingle drain require to produce plan for next meeting, 10th September Paul Merson talk in VH require permission to erect a couple of marquees on the Rec. agreed communicate with Village Hall, provision of a 3rd football pitch on land (currently agricultural) to the south of the Tennis Courts agreed in principle with further information required and consideration of potential issues raised by residents.
- The Village Hall AGM is to be held on Thursday 14th July 2016, 7:30pm.
- County Councillor Adrian Dent attended having sent his report electronically nothing further to add except no planning application had been made re: the footpaths 37 & 38.
- District Councillor Cicely Murfitt gave her report. The Summer edition of the SCDC magazine is out. The boundary review is in the proposal stage concerns over Gamlingay & The Mordens as a boundary. Devolution was discussed. Opportunity for grants for the Community Chest.
- A communication has been received from HCC that tranche 1 of the updates to the **A505 junction** will start in July. It was queried whether CCC had dealt with the new sign at Odsey for the A505 junction possibly this will be checked.
- Four villages have now agreed to share the purchase of the **Speedwatch equipment** (SM, Litlington awaiting final approval, Whaddon and Meldreth). The cost to Steeple Morden will be £600. A concise and excellent schedule of the sharing of the equipment had been received from Brian Burton.
- Footpaths 37 & 38 no formal application has been received yet.
- **Policies**. The Standing Orders and Financial Regulation policies were adopted. Risk Assessment and FOI carried forward to next meeting.
- Election of Working Groups. Planning: Whole PC with Cllr Stuart Martin as leader. Recreation Ground: Cllr Angela Drew. Environmental: Cllrs Sacha Wheatley & Ginny Belson. Village Hall: Cllr Sacha Wheatley. Mobile Warden Scheme: Cllr Angela Drew. Townlands Charity: Cllrs Jeremy Clayton & John Brocklehurst. Finance Working Group: Cllrs Jeremy Clayton, Sacha Wheatley & Ginny Belson. Speedwatch: Cllr Chris Whittington. Review of the working groups will be carried out when more co-opted members are in place.
- Finances: The Clerk was congratulated on a clean bill of health from the audit.
- Rec. Road resurfacing. 3 quotes were received. The cheapest of £7,245 was selected. The PC to liaise with VH to plan to work.
- Cllr Angela Drew gave an update on the Recreation Ground. General maintenance work had taken place. The
 playground needs some specialist attention for minor repairs including the gate which poses a H&S issue.
 Some assistance is needed with Lime Tree suckers (see pg 6). New sign 2 options to be ordered once best
 per annum cost determined. The Working Group is happy to continue emptying the dog/litter bins for the time
 being. The Woodland Trust to be approached to get permission to plant bluebells in White Ponds Wood.
- The work on cleaning/restoration of the Odsey War memorial is to start soon. The offer of donations from residents in Odsey can be used for ongoing maintenance work.
- The future management of the **CCTV** was discussed. It was agreed that the control remains with PC and any assistance needs to be given a terms of reference.
- Matters arising from the APM. Parish Paths: responsibility of County/landowner. Whiteponds Wood paths disabled access responsibility of Woodland Trust. Bulbs as entrances to village quotes to be obtained for troughs. Access to meadow from Rec. proposer asked for plan not received.
- Correspondence. Mobile phone mast in church no longer relevant shelved. Web maps Karen Brown recommended to proceed the Cllrs would like to see the link before progressing. Defibrillator training Mark Crankshaw will sort out.

Save Our Woodland Paths by Cheyney

Proposed changes to the public footpaths 37 and 38 have been submitted which will significantly change the route of these footpaths, and the environment that the footpaths enjoy.

The proposed changes are to the sections through woodland to the NW of Lower Gatley Farm, the area adjacent to buildings of Lower Gatley Farm, and the section from Lower Gatley Farm to Upper Gatley Farm.

The footpaths along by Cheyney Water have enjoyed a very pleasant woodland route by the stream, and the potential loss of this route is of concern. This
 environment is quite unique in the parish, and has been enjoyed by a wide range of users. The proposal is to re-route the path into the field to the west, so that it no longer passes through any woodland, and does not pass along by the stream. Thus the enjoyment of walking the Cheyney Water path would be lost.

A summer poem

Days are lonely as the sun shines longer But nights are cool while the moon shines down with its silver light as I sit Watching... The stars are twinkling In the heavenly moonlight...

The "<u>Mordens Community First Response Group</u>"; hopefully NOT coming to you soon!

What is a "community first response (CFR) group" and who runs it? I hear yourself saying.

A CFR group is run by local volunteers who are trained by the ambulance service (East of England Ambulance Service in our case) to attend emergency calls in the area where they live or work. Their aim is to reach a potential life threatening emergency in the first vital minutes before the ambulance crew arrives on scene.

The volunteer's role is to help stabilise the patient and, in doing so, keep the patient alive until the arrival of the more highly skilled ambulance crew, who are trained to undertake further life saving techniques. When a 999 call is made to the Ambulance service, the call is prioritised to establish if it is suitable to send a Community First Responder to the call. Once this has been established, the nearest available responder group is notified by the provided telephone to alert them to a call within their area. An ambulance will always be mobilised to every call that the responder group attends. A responder will attend Category A **'immediately life – threatening' calls**. These calls can include:

• cardiac arrest • diabetic emergency • unconscious patient

• breathing difficulties • seizures

Being in the local community, the average time to reach the patient should not normally exceed 3-4 minutes, depending on location.

The volunteer will stay on the scene until a full hand-over has been given to the ambulance crew.

The Mordens group, of which I am one, have had thorough training by the East of England Ambulance Service, which will continue on a regular basis. Although we are now trained and ready to go, we are currently raising the funding to purchase the full medical kit, as well as the ongoing running costs once we go live. The initial setup per kit is circa £2000. As I write in the middle of June, in the last 3 weeks, we have received very generous donations from local businesses and individuals to take us over the £1000 mark. The Ambulance Service has kindly loaned us part of the kit until we have raised the full amount, so in effect, allowing us to become operational at the end of June. Our 12 month ambition is to raise sufficient funds for 2 full kits, thus providing a more efficient and timely service.

The group is being run by Wayne Cox and currently has the following volunteers:
