NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (the Village Hall in Winter) at 8.00pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

A copy of the full minutes from the Council Meetings may be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk, Sally Walmesley, Redwood Lodge, South Street, Litlington, Royston SG8 0QR. Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail sally.walmesley@btinternet.com. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website www.steeplemoden.org and the Village Post Office. Discussion on agenda items at the February meeting included the following:

- County Cllr Adrian Dent sent his report via e-mail
- District Cllr Cicely Murfitt gave her report.
 - o Potential for a new park & ride near Trumpington or Granchester Roundabout
 - The proposed solar installations at Flecks Lane, Tadlow and Wrestlingworth have been withdrawn but this does not mean they are completely cancelled if the subsidies increase
 - o Reminder about the EU Referendum
 - o Possible £5 increase in Council Tax. South Cambridgeshire is in the lowest 15 in the Country.
 - o Electoral Boundary Review now to go before the Committee
 - Starlings in Jubilee Way. The tree is proposed to be felled in March after the birds have left
- MHI Application 2016/2017 Cllr Chris Whittington reported that the meeting he attended was favourable and the decision will be announced in March
- The Speedwatch Group met with the police on 8th February and the equipment was handed over. The initial activity will commence immediately after which further discussions will take place to work out what further Speedwatch activity is needed.
- The Litlington and Mordens Mobile Warden Scheme have received a grant from Townlands.
- The Allotment Rent invoice has been issued to the Allotment Committee.
- Recreation Ground/Conservation Area report by Cllr Angela Drew:
 - o Groups is working well
 - \circ David Holt has offered to fill the potholes in the car park, the MOT will cost about £60 the PC agreed this spend
 - o David Holt needs a key for the drop off car park
- The PC has won a grant application (£1,270) from the War Memorials Trust for the refurbishment of the Odsey War Memorial and with the £1,000 from Community Chest, the work can now proceed.
- The outside disabled toilet is to have a combination lock fitted to prevent vandalism and misuse.
- There are no plans for a Cowslip Day in 2016. It was agreed to ask the Harvest Fair Committee if the Queen's 90th Birthday can be recognised at the Harvest Fair.
- Correspondence:
 - o Parking at the Jester. Cars parking at the front are encroaching on the footpath causing pedestrians to walk on the road. The Clerk to write to the Jester.
 - o Parking on Hay Street. This issue has been raised by a local resident with the main problems at school drop off/pick up times. The Clerk to write to the Headmaster.
 - SCDC Parish Council Election Timetable. The Clerk will receive packs shortly. The application deadline is 7th April 2016. More details on page 9.
 - o Motorbikes on the Stret. The motorbikes are there legally so there is nothing that can be done.
- The Chairman is unable to attend the next 2 meetings after which the new Council will form. He thanked his colleagues for their support over his term as Chairman



Good News: Flecks Lane Solar PV Cancelled!

There is some very encouraging news on the solar developments affecting The Mordens, Tadlow and Wrestlingworth that were the subject of last year's consultations.

We, the Flecks Lane Action Group (FLAG), think the proposals last year for solar developments would have been sited inappropriately and a complete misuse of high quality agricultural land. We are not against the use of renewable technology in the right place.

There has been a long silence from the developers since the consultation took place but we have at last heard that the proposals outlined have been cancelled.

No reason was given for the cancellation and we would like to think that it was, at least in part, due to the opposition expressed locally. We cannot say that a proposal for a solar farm along Flecks Lane may not be resurrected in the future, but we now have a better understanding of the issues involved.

Some of the knowledge we have acquired in our campaign has already been used to direct advantage by opponents to the 50MW solar farm proposed by another developer for Dry Drayton. SCDC's Planning Committee unanimously overturned SCDC's planning officers' recommendation to approve the development and refused it. Attitudes are changing, perhaps.

We are grateful for the support we have received. We should also like to acknowledge the invaluable participation of our District Councillor, Cicely Murfitt, as well as the significant and very supportive contribution from Heidi Allen MP and her office.

It has been most pleasing to know that so many people in our community share our views.


We are looking for new players again this year due to the retirement of several senior players in the last few years.

After 7 years in the planning and over 2 years of intense fundraising, over £60,000 has be raised to carry out major work which has now almost complete.

The work commenced on 9th November. The toilets are almost complete. The new doors will be installed in early January.

The project has replaced the existing men's and ladies toilets, added a disabled toilet with baby changing facility and altered the entrance to have electronic doors and an access ramp. This will deliver a much needed enhancements to the hall making it more accessible to the wider community and keeping this very important facility in Steeple Morden alive.

Our regular users will return to the hall in early January and as an added bonus a small team of volunteers have also decorated the main hall whilst it has been closed. We look forward to welcoming you all back and hope to have an opening ceremony in January.
