NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (the Village Hall in Winter) at 8.00pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

A copy of the full minutes from the Council Meetings may be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk, Sally Walmesley, Redwood Lodge, South Street, Litlington, Royston SG8 OQR. Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail <u>sally.walmesley@btinternet.com</u>. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website <u>www.steeplemoden.org</u> and the Village Post Office. Discussion on agenda items at the April meeting included the following:

- A505 Junction No further update from HCC.
- Speedwatch The Speedwatch Team have continued checking speed around the village.

 An abusive motorist is to be cautioned by police.
- White Lines white lines are to be refreshed at Odsey and Station Road.
- Horseriders on Footpaths Horses should not be ridden on footpaths.
- Hay Street Grass Verge the County Highways turned down the request for Planters on the grass verge.
- District Cllr Cicerly Murfitt Reported that the new licensee of the Waggon and Horses has to apply for a permit for the caravan park behind the pub. Two caravans are parked there one of which is not licensed as a CC member. Requests for changes to Footpaths 37 and 38 have been received. Dumping of rubbish at Odsey has been referred to S Cambs DC. The Community Chest is again available for funding local projects.
- Finances Financial statement was passed. It was decided to delay the finalising of Internet Banking until the new Parish Council had been elected.
- Recreation Ground and Conservation Area- More Brushwood needs to be cut on the trees in the centre
 of the Recreation Ground. Car Park Resurfacing a contractor is being sort. A new sign for the
 Recreation Ground has been approved. A fallen tree on the footpath near the Woodland Grange is to be
 removed.
- Football Club no further updates.
- Contract for Emptying Dog Bins has been offered to local clubs.
- **Dog Training Classes** a request to use the Recreation Ground to train dogs in obedience and gun training was made. A 6 month trial period was granted.
- Rectory Farm Solar Power Proposal a request for support in objection be lodged by SM Parish Council in any future applications. To object to a blanket ban without seeing any planning proposals is outside the remit of the Parish Council. It was decided to issue a general statement about not using good agricultural land for solar farms in the next District Plan.
- Tesco Funding for Community Spaces Tesco are offering funds to upgrade Community Projects.





Steeple Morden Speedwatch Group

Most village residents, along with the wider local community, will now be aware of our Village Speedwatch initiative.

With the support of Cambridgeshire Police, we have set up a group of volunteers to help make the roads through our Village safer.

During the past month, we have been monitoring vehicles driving through our Village that have been travelling at excessive speeds. We have monitored over 200 vehicles exceeding the speed limit on the roads within Steeple Morden and have observed some vehicles travelling at 50mph within a 30mph area. We are sure all residents agree that this is unacceptable.

We are happy to report that the impact of the work by our volunteers is now showing an improvement to the overall position. However, there are still high enough numbers of offenders to continue regular monitoring.

The Police were surprised at the high number of drivers exceeding the speed limit through our village and as a result, are often in attendance at our observation points, supporting the work of the volunteers.

The Police have stopped and reported for prosecution a number of drivers for various motoring offences, which is a great support to our community initiative.

Our volunteers also report that we get great support from villagers, with a good response from people walking past our observation points.

With support from the local community, we will continue to try and make our Village roads safer for all.

We thank you for your support and would welcome any one who can spare a couple of hours a week or month to be one of our Volunteers; we need more residents to get involved please.

Speed is one of the main factors in fatal road accidents

In 2013, 3,064 people were killed or seriously injured in crashes where speed was a factor The risk of death is approximately four times higher when a pedestrian is hit at 40mph than at 30mph. The National statistics show that there were 1780 road deaths in 2015, 25% of which were pedestrians

An invitation to the 20th East Anglian Bluegrass Festival 17-19 June 2016

The Bluegrass Festival has been staged annually in Steeple Morden village hall for many years this year will be our 20th anniversary. We are constantly disappointed by low attendance by the population of the local villages, where we know there is strong interest in all types of music. This year, for a limited period only, we intend to offer all local villagers, discounted tickets, which we expect to be available from Steeple Morden Post Office.

'Bluegrass' is folk music derived from the music carried to America, by immigrants from Britain, Ireland and Europe, to the early colonies in the area of the Appalachian Mountains. To begin with, this was based in and around the States of Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky and Tennessee. Once embedded, the local music became Mountain Music, later infused with Gospel and the Blues, from coloured musicians & Church choirs.

As you might expect, there is a huge instrumental tradition, of Fiddle tunes augmented by Banjo and supported by Guitar & double base. Unlike modern music, the instruments speak for them themselves and do not need heavy amplification. The music is easy on the ear for both dance music and listening entertainment.

Over time, the songs have developed a multitude of themes, including Religion, Death, Love, Moonshine, Railways, Convicts, The American Civil War. Often, these reflect the harsh life of the early American Pioneers.

Later, many of these influences were integrated by Kentucky singer/ mandolin player Bill Monroe, who along with legendary banjo player Earl Scruggs and singer/guitarist Lester Flatt, formed 'The Bluegrass Boys'. Their style uses fast tempos and instrumental improvisation, often with 3 part harmony singing. Importantly this is Music guaranteed to get your foot tapping on a relaxed warm June evening in the village hall, where we hold concerts on both the Friday and Saturday nights. During the day, there are a number of workshops run by professional musicians, designed to help budding instrumentalists hone their skills. This year we are hoping to hold open mic sessions during the afternoon.

At any time, impromptu 'jamming sessions', <u>free to all</u>, spark off, so if you have an instrument, bring it along and feel free to join in. For church goers, it would be a sin, to miss the Gospel concert in the Church of Saints Peter and Paul on Sunday morning.
