NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (Village Hall in winter) at 7.30pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the

Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail clerk@steeplemorden.org. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website www.steeplemorden.org and the Village Post Office. Brief notes on agenda items from the Parish Council Meeting on Monday October 14th are included below:

- County Councillor Mr S Kindersley reported that there will be a meeting on November 13th concerning the developments at the Orchard. Recent flooding in Church Lane and Odsey have been reported to South Cambs C. Any other flooding or blocked drains can be reported to the South Cambs web site. The fighting fund for the Cambridge/Oxford railway is short of £25.000 it is imperative we have a fund of £50,000 ready to fight to change the southern route. If this went ahead it could result in a 25% reduction in value of properties fronting the railway.
- District Councillor Heather Williams reported on the flooding in Church Lane. The planning department at South Cambs C is to go ahead with outsourcing some foundation and planning applications. South Cambs .C is also looking into on shore wind farms whether permission can be granted for small schemes.
- **A505** Herts C.C is not going to alter the Steeple Morden junction. But it plans to close the right to cross the A505 to turn towards Baldock at the Litlington crossing.
- Traffic Our MVAS's seem to be working in slowing down the traffic. The fact that they are moved quite frequently seems to hit the spot. Hopefully the Speedwatch Team with reconvene in the new year.
- Recreation Ground and Conservation Area- Quotes have been received concerning the village tree survey. It was decided to have each tree 'tagged' with a number so that they could easily be identified if there was a problem. Another quote has been requested to top the trees around the play area.
- Footpaths Footpath 10 Report from a meeting with the Rights of Way Officer/Definitive Maps Officer on 7th October suggested the village either re-instate the footpath or apply to have the footpath re-directed. As the old footpath went along the back of the children's play area behind the old grass tennis courts to reinstate the footpath is not an option, it will have to be re-directed at a cost of £3000!
- Dog Bin a dog bin was requested for Bogs Gap Lane. This is still on-going.
- Security Cameras the Village Hall cameras are in operation.
- Update on New Parish Website quotes have been received from two companies.
- Litterpick two successful Litterpicks have taken place with a 'good turnout' of pickers. Over 20 bags of rubbish have been successfully recycled. Two more dates are scheduled for November see (p4).
- Fireworks SM Primary School have requested the use of the conservation area on November 2nd to hold their annual Firework display.

The next committee meeting will be held on 13th November.
