## A New Local Plan

For the first time ever Cambridge City Council and the South Cambridgeshire District Council are developing a joint Local Plan covering the whole of Greater Cambridge.

You are right to think that we only just adopted Local Plans for both Councils last year. However, making a new Local Plan takes a number of years.

What is a Local Plan?

A Local Plan is a legal document that shows how our area will change over the coming decades it sets out –

**What we build in the area** – new homes, workspace and facilities, and how we change existing areas for the better.

**Where we build** – and how that relates to infrastructure, including transport links, schools, health and utilities.

**How we build** – in all aspects of design and layout.

It sets out how South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge will change over the coming decades to meet big challenges of the future in ways that our communities want to see.

### **What can I influence?**

It is true that some things are set by central government – for example we must plan for at least the minimum number of new homes under the method the government requires, and meet national standards such as building regulations and the environmental efficiency. But the big decisions are down to you to help us shape:

- Where new development should go?
- What kind of homes and businesses should we be planning?
- How ambitious should we be about meeting climate change?
- What standards should we be setting for design?



## NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (Village Hall in winter) at 7.30pm. The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

Brief notes on agenda items from the Parish Council Meeting on January 13th are included below.

- **County Councillor Mr S Kindersley** - reported that he will be attending a meeting with Cam Bus concerning extended routes to include linking Ashwell, Guilden and Steeple Morden to the train station. Contact Cllr Kindersley if this is of interest to you asap.  
He also attended a meeting concerning the planning application for the proposed Odsey/Ashwell station car park. Plans for a railway station on the site of Addenbrooke/Papworth Hospitals campus has been proposed. Some possible funding could come from the bio-chemical companies on site.
- **District Councillor Heather Williams** reported that the Cambridge City Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council were compiling a Local Plan to covering the whole of Greater Cambridge. **Your views are needed!**  
Consultations were taking place with regard to a railway station on the hospital campus. Three trees have been donated to every Parish Council.
- **Litterpick -Cllr Ginny Belson** has issued the new Litterpick schedules for 2020. (p6 of the Newsletter)
- **Recreation Ground Maintenance** - the PC have received the Tree Survey report concerning the trees on the recreation ground, quotes have been issued to cover the work needed to take place to make certain trees safe. Grasscutting contacts for 20/21 are also ongoing.
- **Traffic - Cllr Keith Austin's** breakdown of our speeds coming and going in the Village caused quite a stir on the SM Facebook. Several suggestions made regarding traffic calming such as 'double yellow lines', traffic calming speed bumps, and 20mph signs near the school, have all been muted by the Parish Council, but subsequently turned down by the Highways Committee or Police as unworkable. However, under discussion are 40mph buffers coming into the Village, especially on Station Road.
- **PC Priestley** - if you wish to air your views on traffic or other matters regarding security, break-ins, car parking, PC Priestley will be attending the next Parish Meeting, which will begin at 7.00pm. All parishioners welcome.
- **Village Website.** Hopefully we will have a new Website up and running shortly.
- **Accident at the SM Tennis Courts** - there was an unfortunate incident on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> January. An ambulance was called but the patient who was seriously injured could not be brought to the ambulance due to the lack of access points. The Parish Council will provide an access point next to the 'kissing gate'. A gap app. 122 cm wide with concrete posts, just wide enough for a stretcher or wheel chair access.



Since March this year the Parish Council has operated two MVAS camera (Mobile Vehicle-activated signs) in our village with the aim to reduce the speed of all vehicles. They record the speed, date and time of every vehicle passing and have been sited at the entrances to the village on Station Road, Hay Street, Ashwell Road and Litlington Road.

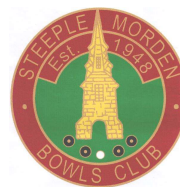
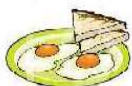
