
NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (the Village Hall in Winter) at 8.00pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

A copy of the full minutes from the Council Meetings may be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk, Sally Walmesley, Redwood Lodge, South Street, Litlington, Royston SG8 0QR. Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail sally.walmesley@btinternet.com. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website www.steeplemoden.org and the Village Post Office. Discussion on agenda items at the October meeting included the following:

- A parishioner raised the issue of the **Morden Magpies goals** facing so that the rear of the goal is parallel with Hay Street and if the ball goes over the hedge this may cause an accident. The PC to check if the Magpies have done a risk assessment/have insurance.
- A parishioner raised the use of **speeding along Hay Street**. After much discussion 2 possibilities were going to be considered: a 20mph limit from the drop off car park to the Waggon and Horses, setting up a Speedwatch team.
- A parishioner raised the issue of **medium sized school coaches turning around in Craft Way**. The Clerk to contact the Headmaster of the school to ensure that the contractor is aware that this is both dangerous and shouldn't be allowed.
- Karen Brown gave an update on the **Village Hall Refurbishment project**. The Hall will close from 9th November 2015 until Christmas. Karen to write a note to the PC requesting the payment of the grant from the PC.
- The Chairman gave an update on **the A505 junction**. A meeting took place with the Chairman of Ashwell Parish Council. They are in favour of pursuing a reduction to 50mph at that junction and will take this to the Herts. Transport Committee. There are also consultations taking place with various police forces to get their view on the junction safety.
- The request for **re-painting of the yellow lines outside the school** and of the bus stop have been completed.
- District Councillor Cicely Murfitt gave her report. South Cambs. Have been voted the **5th best council in the country for collecting council tax** at 99.3%. There is to be a change to **the powers of Parish Councils in respect of planning** and this will take effect on Wednesday 14th October. The **Morden Grange fertiliser storage planning request** has won its appeal - there are concerns over access.
- The **Financial Statement** was approved. Internet banking has been set up on the deposit account; the current account will follow soon.
- The PC discussed **Freedom of Information documents on the village website**. Morden Web Design will have a look into options.
- The Chairman informed the PC that an initial meeting of a possible **Recreation Ground working group** will take place on Tuesday 20th October. Whilst there has been some difficulties with tasks on the Recreation Ground (bins, weeds, fencing), all of these tasks are now in hand and are being dealt with.
- The Chairman informed the PC that the application to the **War Memorials Trust** for a grant to clean and repair Odsey War Memorial has been submitted and a decision is expected in December. The Clerk has also applied for a grant to cover this work from Cambs. Community Chest.
- The PC agreed to consider a combination lock (from a suggestion by a parishioner) for the **disabled toilet** if the new standard lock has not been ordered.
- **2015/2016 Insurance Schedule Review** - agreed to wait until the new benches are in place.
- The PC decided that the effort required to obtain continued **Quality status** was not worth it for the benefits. The logo needs removing from the Newsletter and website at the end of the year.
- **OMYA have offered some more wood** as a donation to the village. With no-one on the PC having come forward to deal with the wood, the Chairman suggest that we pursue the option of engaging a contractor (who will donate a portion of cash to the village).
- The Chairman informed the PC that as article in the upcoming Newsletter will be informing and requesting new Parish Councillors for the **May 2016 Elections** (see page 13).





Are you Concerned about Speeding in Steeple Morden?

From time to time the issue of speeding is raised to the Parish Council and so now, in conjunction with South

Cambridgeshire Speedwatch, Parishioners are being given the opportunity to help the police to make our village safer.

The Speedwatch scheme allows the public to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood. It is used in areas where speeding has been identified as a priority at quarterly neighbourhood panel meetings.

The scheme is run by the force alongside the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Road Safety Partnership. It is about educating motorists in the law in relation to speeding and monitoring any trends in speeding in neighbourhoods.

Volunteers are trained to use speed indicator devices which displays vehicle speed. The registered owner of any vehicle seen exceeding the speed limit is sent an advisory letter from their local neighbourhood policing team, explaining that speeding is unacceptable to the local community

FAQs

How do I become a volunteer?

To find out more about becoming a Speedwatch volunteer contact David Brown, Chairman of the Parish Council (davidjohnbrown@btinternet.com) or speedwatch directly (Speedwatch@cambs.pnn.police.uk).

How much time will I need to give up?

There is no minimum time set but an expectation that sufficient hours are given to make the scheme viable.

Do you get training?

Yes full training is given to volunteers. This training will be provided by your local neighbourhood team in your neighbourhood and will depend on the needs of the group assembled.

Is it safe for volunteers?

Volunteers are given full training and safety equipment to ensure they are clearly visible to road users.

Will officers still carry out speed checks?

Areas where speeding is identified as an issue will be considered for enforcement work by officers.

What equipment is used?

Volunteers are provided with high visibility jackets and conduct speed checks using speed indicator devices. The vehicles speed is then displayed on the monitor.

Will records of the offending vehicles be kept?

Information gathered during the checks will be used to target enforcement and education measures. Persistent offenders will receive a visit from officers.






All the bookings and regular users have been assisted by the Committee to locate an alternative, temporary venue whilst the work is completed.

The application had been dated the 22nd May but the planning office had not received it until the end of July. The conditions applied to the boundaries and general landscaping, which had been addressed, but there was still a requirement for an archaeological survey which could no longer be carried out as work was underway on the site. The planning officer had visited the site and asked for work to stop until this is resolved.
