NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

QUALITY PARISH

The Full PC meets on the second Monday in the in the Cricket Pavilion (the Village Hall in Winter) at 8.00pm.

The meeting is listed every month in the Village Post Office window, on the Notice Board at the Recreation Ground, and in Odsey near the station.

A copy of the full minutes from the Council Meetings may be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk, Sally Walmesley, Redwood Lodge, South Street, Litlington, Royston SG8 OQR. Telephone 01763 852137 or e-mail sally.walmesley@btinternet.com. Minutes can also be viewed on the Steeple Morden Village Website www.steeplemoden.org and the Village Post Office. Discussion on agenda items at the September meeting included the following:

- Karen Brown raised an issue on behalf of a local resident as to the unsightly condition of a house on Cheyney Street the PC agreed to write to the owners of the property.
- Proposals were considered by the PC from SMFC which were approved subject to certain conditions.
- A505 106 monies from OMYA have been received by Herts. CC. Cllrs David Brown and Sacha Wheatley are
 meeting with Ashwell PC in October to try to get support for the proposed safety audit. The PC are also to
 write to Herts. CC (under the Freedom of Information Act) to see what plans they have for the funds.
- CIIr John Brocklehurst informed the PC that the parishioners who have experience of running car parks are to speak directly with Jeremy Fordham in respect of the Odsey Car Park. This item will now be removed from the agenda.
- The PC are waiting for the Tree Officer in respect of North Brook End Trees in order to expedite the process, it was agreed to raise a formal complaint about the gaps.
- The PC is to raise the issue as to the condition of the footpath by 90 Hay Street with the relevant authority.
- County Councillor Adrian Dent gave his report. He is still dealing with the situation at Bassingbourn Barracks,
 has circulated information about street lighting and reported that the footpaths maintenance contract has
 been awarded to a new company which has caused delays. He also said that the latest on Superfast Broadband
 delivery for Steeple Morden is September to December.
- District Councillor Cicely Murfitt gave her report. The South Cambs. Magazine should have been delivered to all. A workshop to discuss changed in boundaries has taken place which has caused her some worries about the reduction in District Councillors and the possibility that new District Councillors nay not live in the wards they cover,
- The Bowls Club requested a contribution from the PC towards the cameras they had installed as part of the CCTV the request was declined as the PC is unable to provide financial assistance to the sporting clubs.
- Recreation Ground there has been some complaints about weeds and overflowing bins both these items
 have are now being dealt with. For the future the Chairman is in discussions with volunteers to have a
 maintenance team headed up by CIIr Angela Drew.
- A grant has been applied for to the War Memorials Trust for cleaning and re-etching of the Odsey Memorial. In addition donations have been pledged by the Fordham family. The grant application outcome is expected to be received in December after which the PC will decide how to proceed.
- Discussions took place regarding the outside/public disabled toilet and recent vandalism and misuse. One
 option was to lock it and give a key to various parties. Reluctantly, it was decided that this was the best
 solution.
- The PC proposed to install 3 new benches and 1 picnic bench as part of their Special Projects initiative. They
 should be installed in the next few weeks. RE: the Skate Park Cllr Wheatley is to catch up with the project
 owner.
- The PC considered a request for a loan of £5,000 from the Village Hall so that the refurbishment could progress. It was agreed, as the hall is used by the whole village and the VH Committee have done well with fundraising so far, to donate (rather than loan) the requested £5K to the project.
- Various correspondences were considered. Request for Bluegrass Festival 17th-19th June 2016. Steeple Morden Primary School Bonfire Event 7th November 2015. Request for 30mph stickers from a Station Road resident some were located and will be distributed. 10K Steeple Chase.
- The Chairman is publishing a full page "request for Councillors" for next May's Election in the October Newsletter. The PC agreed for the October Newsletter to be a full print.



Good Afternoon South Cambs Resident.

I hope that this email finds you well and that you are enjoying our fine (if mixed) Summer so far.

As the subject line of this email states- I need your help. There are many types of crime that affect us here in South Cambs but none as shocking as human trafficking and slavery. Many of us would quite justifiably think that slavery had long been consigned to the history books but as recent media reporting has shown, it not only exists but is a growing force.

It would be easy to think of this as something that is happening abroad or confined to our cities. I'm afraid that I have to tell you that slavery and exploitation are happening right here, under our noses. As commander of local policing this is something that sits very heavily on my conscience and I am determined to do everything in my power to drive it out, but I need your help to do this.

The greatest challenge we face when tackling slavery is that it doesn't look like it used to do. Modern day slavers don't need chains and manacles- their methods are far more insidious and this can allow it to pass almost un-noticed: possibly even in your street. To tackle this menace we therefore need to raise aw areness about how modern slavery manifests itself- how to spot the tell tale signs and how to safely report concerns and suspicions to the police.

With this in mind and with the help of our partners in South Cambs District Council and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner we are holding an anti-slavery day on **Saturday 17th October 2015 between 10am-1pm** in the council chamber at SCDC. The summit will include award winning films from our partner charity 'Unchosen', presentations from guest speakers and a panel of experts who will be able to answer any questions that you have about modern day slavery. My goal is to have every village in South Cambs represented by a delegate and I would like to invite **you** to represent your community.

The role of the delegate will be two-fold. Firstly to attend our summit and learn all about modern day slavery. Secondly to spread the word in your local community by writing a piece for your local village new sletter or magazine after the summit about what you've seen and learnt.

If you would be interested in representing your village and helping your local officers defeat slavery please contact me directly by responding to this email and I will be able to answer any of your questions and provide more details.


