#### **GIVING OUR WHOLE SELF**

I don't want you to give to us from your abundance. I don't need money from your abundance. Instead, I ask that you share in our work. I ask that you lend your hands in understanding. Come and help care for our needy. Come and see. This very day I have found myself with some of our people who came to one of our homes to eat. They are such kind people! They give thanks from the very bottom of their hearts. They have NOTHING! It isn't that we have given them any extras, just some sandwiches and a cup of tea. Very little! But it has been enough to give them the sense that they are loved, that there is a place where they can come. They are being offered a concrete expression of love. They are being taken into account. This is something I wanted to share with you.

I think we need to grow more as co-workers, taking the place that is rightfully ours. Sharing is the distinctive note of co-workers. I repeat that I don't want you to give to me from your abundance. I want you to give with the attitude of that little boy who said: "I will not eat sugar for three days. I will give it to Mother Teresa." Little things like that make all the difference. I am convinced that for us as adults that seems like something insignificant. But we forget that that child loved with a big heart. And there are so many things that happen around us that go almost unnoticed.

Children in England have been doing this kind of thing for the last twenty years. They have been giving bread to the children of Calcutta. More than four thousand Indian children receive their daily ration of bread, thanks to the generosity of these children. It is something truly beautiful.

ST EDMUNDS SVP is our local branch of the St Vincent de Paul Society, an international Christian charity working to support disadvantaged people. In the Godalming area this may be the elderly housebound, the lonely and those in poor health, as well as families with very limited means. They make personal visits to their homes, and keep in touch in other ways such as by arranging tea afternoons and taking people to hospital appointments. They have provided material assistance where it is needed, including contributions to the Godalming Foodbank.

They also support people in other parts of the world afflicted by natural disasters (e g Kerala) or war and civil unrest (e g South Sudan) by donations administered through local members of the SVP.

They raise funds through donations and by running stalls at local fetes or charity fairs. They are hugely grateful for the support they receive from St Edmund's Parishioners and others in this area.

There are about a dozen members who meet every fortnight to discuss their work and pray together. Why no go and join them! Their phone number is 07990 717067.

This week sees the end of our second parish-wide Alpha programme, and I know from conversations with parishioners that the course has been well received and beneficial. The Holy Spirit Day was one of many highlights in an excellently presented and run

course. I thank all who have helped or been involved in some way.

Hopefully your attendance on an Alpha course has inspired you to see that we all need the fun, friendship and faith that the course offers. Our role now is to reach out to others, both by walking alongside them and by serving them. One way to do this will be to invite and bring other people along to the next Alpha course and more details on this will follow in the New Year. I would also like to encourage all those parishioners who have not yet been on one of Alpha courses to attend next year's course. Going forward, I believe it is really important for our parish that everybody takes advantage of this course.

However, we need to remember that we have only just started out on our journey of Divine Renovation. So as we approach the Christmas holidays, the first thing is for everybody to have a well-earned break with family and loved ones, and also the chance to reflect on what we as a parish have done and learnt this year as we move forward on our Divine Renovation journey.

The question you may be asking yourselves is "What else is being planned?" As you know I recently announced our next Divine Renovation initiative with the setting up of three "DR Reading Groups" giving you the opportunity to explore your faith together in small informal weekly sessions. The groups are now under way and being led by lay members of the parish,

drawing from the themes of personal and shared faith as discussed in "Divine Renovation". This challenging and inspirational book identifies the need to live out our fundamental Christian vocation as missionary discipleship. Sessions invite discussion of the processes Fr Mallon has used to create a joyful invitational culture in his own parish and how these processes can be used by us here in Godalming.

Looked at in a wider context, DR Reading Groups are a part of the process which we have embarked upon in this parish to make ourselves the Body of Christ in Godalming. The first three steps in this process involve attending the current Alpha course, helping on Alpha (if you are able) and participating in a DR Reading Group. For this reason, I am very keen that those who have attended an Alpha course should now be joining a Reading Group. My aim is that as well as next year's Alpha programme we will also set up more DR Reading Groups, and I will confirm details in the New Year.

There are other initiatives that I will be announcing shortly, and these are still in the planning stage and include a Faith exploration group and a Lent group but more on this in the coming weeks. However, to move forward and properly support and resource all these exciting initiatives will require a generous commitment by parishioners and I do believe everybody has a part to play.

Many thanks for all the support and encouragement that I have received so far as we continue on our Divine Renovation journey. Let's make sure that our whole parish moves forward together in faith and love.
