### WHERE IS GOD?

"Come now, insignificant human being, fly for a moment from your affairs, escape for a little while from the tumult of your thoughts. Put aside now your weighty cares and leave your wearisome toils. Abandon yourself for a little to God and rest for a little in him.

Enter into the inner chamber of your soul, shut out everything save God. .......Speak now, my whole heart, speak now to God......Come then, Lord my God, teach my heart where and how to seek you, where and how to find you.

Lord, if you are not present here, where, since you are absent, shall I look for you? On the other hand, if you are everywhere why then, since you are present, do I not see you? Lord, you are my God and my Lord, and never have I seen you. You have created me.....I was made in order to see you, and I have not yet accomplished what I was made for.

Look upon us, Lord; hear us, enlighten us, show yourself to us that it may be well with us, for without you it goes so ill for us. Have pity upon our efforts and our strivings towards you, for we can avail nothing without you.

Teach me to seek you, and reveal yourself to me as I seek, because I can neither seek you if you do not teach me how, nor find you unless you reveal yourself. Let me seek you in desiring you; let me desire you in seeking you; let me find you in loving you; let me love you in finding you."

<u>CHRISTMAS OFFERTORY COLLECTION – GIFT AID</u> As you all know, the money offered at Christmas is your gift to Fr David. If you are a member of our Gift Aid Scheme, the Parish is able to claim 25% of the amount of your donation for its funds in the usual way – but only if your offering is identifiable.

Those of you who have boxes of envelopes will have a special one for Christmas which you can use. If you cannot find this or perhaps leave it at home, you can use a blank, white (unnumbered) envelope (there will be supplies at all Mass Centres) as long as you put your usual envelope number on it.

For those of you who donate by Bankers' Order and have signed a Gift Aid Declaration for this Parish, any extra offering on the day can be gift-aided if you use one of the blank, white envelopes and put your telephone number (last 6 digits) or name on it – as you do for certain Second Collections during the year.

Please note that any Parishioner or visitor who may wish to make a on-off Gift Aid donation (and who is not already registered with us) could use one of the yellow envelopes, completing the information requested on it.

As you will appreciate, being able to claim 25% of your Christmas offering makes a substantial difference to Parish funds, so it would be very helpful if those of you in our Gift Aid Scheme would use envelopes if at all possible.

**EVENING OF PRAYER FOR PARISH RENEWAL** All Parishioners are invited to the third 'Evening of Prayer for Parish Renewal' which takes place on **Wednesday**, **19th December** at 7 45 p m in **St** Joseph's Church. The evening includes readings, music and a quiet time for reflection and shared prayer, followed by refreshments in St Joseph's Room at 8 30 p m.

At the end of November we finished our second parish Alpha course of the year. I thought that it might be useful to share with you the experiences of those who attended.

The Autumn Alpha course differed from the Summer course in that it was not specifically aimed at parishioners. Everybody was welcome.
