REFLECTION

CHRISTMAS CONTEMPLATION

The mysticism of the ordinary in our relationship with God, the little baby, is humanly mystifying, mystifying to a degree which dwells beyond human reasoning or understanding. The cord of connection cannot be made by using terms of magnitude such as awesome, magnificent, overpowering, or all enveloping. For us humans to become, in the slightest way, aware that God came to dwell with us in the form of a very vulnerable human child, we must ourselves live and occupy the very ordinariness and simplicity that that little baby occupied. 'Unless you become like little children you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven.'

We all remember, as young mothers and fathers, our babies clasping their fingers round just one of ours. It is certain that the overwhelming sense of joy, love and trust of that precious moment remains with us for life. The message is so unique and yet so ordinarily natural, as to give just a glimpse of the mysticism of human love. Watching a baby clasping the finger of its parent tells us that the baby loves and needs them, as much as the parent loves and needs this very vulnerable new born human being: surely the ultimate sign of HOPE and TRUST? And at the same time that those small delicate fingers are enwrapped round the parent's finger, the eyes of both baby and parent meet, transfixed by a bond no words can describe; an ultimate sign of FAITH !? Apart from demonstrating human love, it also, and just as powerfully, demonstrates the endless depth of the love of the Being that created it. There could never be any other ordinary human way than to provide the ultimate in an allembracing universal and eternal love, than the message of: 'I am your loving baby, BELIEVE in me.' This very unique and mystical love message was further reinforced by that same baby who, thirty odd years later, and now a fully grown man, sealed the eternal love of God by CHARITABLY sacrificing his innocent life for all of us, ensuring a pathway for humankind to follow to an eternal love of a REDEEMING baby.

May you all have a Holy, Joyful and Meaningful Christmas and New Year.

know, the money offered at Christmas is your gift to Fr David. If you are a member of our Gift Aid Scheme, the Parish is able to claim 25% of the amount of your donation for its funds in the usual way – but only if your offering is identifiable.

Those of you who have boxes of envelopes will have a special one for Christmas which you can use. If you cannot find this or perhaps leave it at home, you can use a blank, white (unnumbered) envelope (there will be supplies at all Mass Centres) as long as you put your usual envelope number on it.

For those of you who donate by Bankers' Order and have signed a Gift Aid Declaration for this Parish, any extra offering on the day can be gift-aided if you use one of the blank, white envelopes and put your telephone number (last 6 digits) or name on it – as you do for certain Second Collections during the year.

Please note that any Parishioner or visitor who may wish to make a on-off Gift Aid donation (and who is not already

registered with us) could use one of the yellow envelopes, completing the information requested on it.
