# LMS Pilgrimage to Holywell – 2:30 pm on Sun 7 July



High Mass of the St Winifride will be celebrated in the parish church at 2.30pm by Priests of the ICKSP, followed by a Rosary procession down to the Well where the relic of St Winefride will be presented for veneration. Music will be provided by <u>Schola Gregoriana Malverniensis</u>.

St Winefride lived in the 6th / 7th century near Treffynon (Holywell). Miraculous tales are told of her and her cult has been widespread since the Middle Ages. The main centres of devotion were Shrewsbury, where her remains were enshrined in 1138, and the well at Holywell where she was beheaded and then

restored to life by her uncle, St Beuno. The well has remained a place of healing and pilgrimage through the Reformation to the present day. For full details see the LMS Pilgrimage to Holywell webpage. (*Photo: John Aron.*)
