Gaudium magnum: weekly Traditional Latin Mass has arrived at St Wulstan's!

I am delighted to confirm that beginning on Sunday 8 September there will be a *Missa Cantata* at St Wulstan's, Little Malvern **every Sunday**. Note that all Masses will begin at the slightly later time of **3:15 p.m.** It is also hoped to offer **refreshments after Mass each Sunday**.



Typically Masses on 2nd and 4th Sundays will continue to be celebrated by Dom Jonathan Rollinson OSB (Belmont Abbey) whilst the additional Masses on the remaining Sundays will be celebrated by Can. Scott Smith ICKSP who is based at St Winifride's, Shrewsbury. Can. Smith's first visit to St Wulstan's will therefore be on Sunday 15 September.



We are very grateful not only to Dom Jonathan and Can. Smith for coming to celebrate Mass for us but also for the support and encouragement we have received from the parish priest, Dom Edward Crouzet OSB (Downside), from Can. Amaury Montjean ICKSP, and from Archbishop Bernard Longley which has made celebrating Traditional Latin Masses every Sunday at St Wulstan's possible.

Music at all Masses will continue to be provided by Schola Gregoriana Malverniensis.


LMS Pilgrimage to Glastonbury – Saturday 7 September

Our first "Annual Report" is also now available on the website.


The Latin Mass Society of England & Wales







