31st December 2017

As an example for us to follow, the Holy Family can seem a little too perfect: when we consider the more dramatic events of the Christmas and Easter story, it can seem so far removed from us. And yet, as today's Gospel reminds us there were also the so-called hidden years - the many years of family life in Nazareth, spent in ordinary things. During that time, we hear how Jesus grew and matured, and in the glimpse of that family life we see our example.

Our celebration of this feast announces that there is a lasting value in the ideals of family life, and the relationship

between husband, wife, parents and children. Whatever the changing details of each age, honour, understanding and love always remain the recipe for the perfect, and holy, human family. It is love that we put on over all the other clothes of changing cultures and places, to guarantee the life of the family in imitation of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. So whatever the shape and size of your family, even if your family is just you, today is for you.

Thank you: to everyone who has helped in any way in our celebrations of the Feast of Christmas. Everything was splendid in all 3 churches. A special thanks to flower arrangers and sacristans. Thank you everyone.

Fr Philip Writes:

As we come to the end of a year we all look back and forward. 2017 has been a year of yet more changes for our parishes. With the arrival of Fr Michael we have adapted to new ways. The outstanding thought for me of 2017 is how blest we are with so many people who contribute in so many ways to parish life and what a joy it is for me to be your parish priest.

What of 2018? None of us knows what is in store. But a few things will point the way. Lent starts early (Feb 14th!) We hope to have another week of guided prayer. The pilgrims will have already started packing for Malta! In St T the meeting room extension will give us much needed facilities. We hope work will start in the Spring. I hope that in St O we can make some progress on the old club. In St MM we will need to find new volunteers for many things.

The Archbishop has appointed me as Moderator of the Synod which will be held in 2020. This will mean many more meetings and a great deal of extra work as we prepare for the first Synod the Diocese has held since 1954. You can read about the Synod in the article I have written for the January edition of the Catholic Pic.

In the Diocese we have 3 ordinations. These will take place in the Cathedral in July. This is the most we have had for 6 years. But we are still expecting more retirements (and deaths) than ordinations! As the Archbishop reminded us in his Advent Pastoral Letter we must always live confident that the Church is in the hands of God.
