3rd Sunday of Lent 4th March 2018

Christ, the power and the wisdom of God

We continue our Lenten journey and join Jesus this week as he goes up to Jerusalem. Our readings offer us the wisdom of God's law in the commandments, and Jesus's forceful action regarding the true meaning of God's Temple.

The ten commandments in the **1st Reading** from Exodus present the Law as a freedom charter – we have been freed from slavery to serve God.

Psalm 18 is a joyful poem of praise for God's precepts. It links the teaching of the commandments to their personification in Jesus – wisdom, truth and light. St Paul in the **2nd Reading** preaches a crucified Christ, an obstacle to some, but for Christ's followers, through his death and resurrection, he is the power and the wisdom of God.

In the **Gospel**, Jesus ejects the buyers and sellers from the Temple and in doing so reveals himself as the true Temple. Like the Temple, he too, will be destroyed in his body, but will rise again.
