12th Sunday in Ordinary Time 21st June 2020

Jesus instructed the Twelve: 'Do not be afraid'.

Today's readings are very apt for our current times, where many of us are experiencing vulnerability, tension, and unpredictability. Yet as followers of Christ, we are being called to trust in God our Father, who knows us intimately and understands our needs.

In the **First Reading**, we hear Jeremiah's challenging voice giving an unpopular message to the people, who must change their self-centred way of living. In his isolation, Jeremiah turns to the Lord to ask for help, for he needs friendship in very real ways in his difficulties.

The **Psalm** is a cry of anguish from one in great danger. Yet despite his distress, the psalmist has confidence in the great love of God.

Paul teaches that the consequence of sin is 'death': a death that includes the death of our friendship with God. But Paul also emphasises the abundant reality of divine grace; a free gift introduced into the world through Christ Jesus (**Second Reading**).

In today's **Gospel**, Jesus reminds the Twelve that they are not promised success; they will suffer. Yet he bids them repeatedly, 'Do not be afraid'. The Father's tender care will never desert them. God is on their side: not as a remote figure, but as a Father who has intimate knowledge of and care for each of them.

In these our own times of trial and vulnerability, we pray for God's guidance and teaching. 'Lord, you invite us to cry out with complete confidence in the Father's boundless love. This day we offer you praise and thanks for your abundant gifts to us in our poverty and weakness.'

<u>Celebrations of Holy Mass</u>: Fr. Roy / Fr. Michael will continue to celebrate Mass, in a church within our parishes, without the faithful on a daily basis. The continuing celebration of Mass ensures that the faithful can join in spiritual communion with the priests of the Church.

Re-opening of Churches: Following recent announcements from the government and from the Archbishop. I can now confirm that St Teresa's church in Penwortham is authorised by the Archbishop to open, **for private prayer only**, provided we comply with the "Diocesan Guidelines on the Re-opening of Churches for Private Prayer", on:

> Sundays from 11.00am till 1.00pm Tuesdays from 11.00am till 1.00pm Thursdays from 11.00am till 1.00pm

St. Teresa's church will be open **for private prayer only**, at 11.00am until 1.00pm from Sunday 21st June. **Parishioners who are self-isolating, Shielding, or Vulnerable, or have any Covid-19 symptoms, should not attend.**

We have now had people come forward to volunteer to be 'Church Stewards' to assist the re-opening of Churches **for Private Prayer**. Please note that when St Teresa's does open for private prayer, there will be no books, pamphlets, sheets of paper or votive candles in use. The guidelines will be kept under review and revisited where necessary. It is also possible that the authorisation for the opening of St. Teresa's church could be withdrawn at very short notice. Hopefully, all will go to plan and this will be the start of things to come.

Food Bank Donations. The church can now open for '**private prayer**' only, and at present, it is not possible for food donations to be left. Instead, monetary donations may be made to 'Churches Together in Penwortham'. The bank details required are the sort code 30 - 96 - 85, with the account number of 00415955. Many thanks to those people who have already given so generously. We have also been well supported by several supermarkets.

St Oswald's: You will have seen in the news that it is proposed to open churches for private prayer in a cautious manner with primary concern for the health and safety of the people.
