

# 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time 26th July 2020 The Kingdom of Heaven ...

As Ordinary Time continues, we are still in the central part of Matthew's Gospel where Jesus is teaching by means of parables. Today we have four more parables to add to the four already heard over the last couple of Sundays. These parables stress in particular the great value of the kingdom.

In the **First Reading** we have the narrative of the young king Solomon asking God for the gift of wisdom, so as to discern the true value of things and rule his people with understanding.

The verses taken from the **Psalm** extol the value of God's law, a treasure that brings true happiness.

St Paul, in the **Second Reading**, reveals the mutuality between the faithful follower and the generosity of the Father, who will justify and glorify those he has called.

In the **Gospel** the kingdom of heaven is likened to finding a treasure and selling everything to possess it. Good and bad coexist until the time of final judgment.

Maybe this week we can pray for the grace to recognize the kingdom amongst us and around us.

# **Cautious Reopening of our Churches for public worship**

It has been wonderful to open our churches for private prayer over the last few weeks and to be able to greet parishioners once again. Thank you to the volunteers that have offered to help at this time. We are now in a position to open up for mass although there will be some changes that we will have to get used to.

# Masses when you can attend will resume from the vigil Sunday Mass on 1<sup>st</sup> August, initially at St Teresa's and St Oswald's. Mass times and dates will largely depend on the availability of volunteers to Steward the Masses.

The number of people attending each mass will have to be limited, using the 1m+ guidelines, in order to retain social distancing. The numbers allowed will be posted at the entrance to each church. If you are a part of the same bubble at home then you will count as one.

If you are able to attend a midweek mass then please do so allowing those who can only attend our weekend masses to do so.

## What to expect.

**Before you arrive:** You should avoid bringing any unnecessary items into church, e.g. shopping bags, as you will not be returning to your seat once you have received Holy Communion.

## When you arrive:

## All persons attending a service in church must wear a face covering at all times.

\* You will be welcomed by a volunteer steward and you may be asked to give your contact details.

- \* You will be directed to the hand sanitiser.
- \* You will be directed to a bench. It may not be where you usually sit.
- \* You must adhere to social distancing guidelines in place
- \* Any children accompanying you must do the same.
- \* Baskets will be available at the entrance (and exit) for your weekly envelopes or other contributions.

Toilets will remain closed at all times except for a genuine emergency.

**During Mass:** There will be no Sign of Peace. There will be no singing. *Holy Communion:* Will be distributed *after the final dismissal of the Mass.* 

\* The words "The Body of Christ" and the reply "Amen" will only be said once at the beginning of distribution. They will not to be repeated for each person receiving Holy Communion.

\* The volunteer stewards will direct you to approach the altar to receive Holy Communion.

\* People receiving Communion will be instructed to approach the altar with their arms outstretched so as to maintain a reasonable distance from the minister.

- \* You may only receive the Sacred Host in your hand and not on your tongue.
- \* Communicants must avoid skin to skin contact with the minister's hands.
- \* You must then step to one side, lower your face covering and place the
- \* Sacred Host in your mouth then follow directions to leave the church immediately.

**After Mass** - Use only the designated exit. Please take home any newsletters, Mass sheets and other papers you may use. Please do not gather in the church porch or on church property for conversations. Continue to wear your face covering until you leave the area where other people are.
