## 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2nd August 2020

## Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ!

In today's readings, we celebrate the great love of God, who not only gives us life, but desires to

sustain and nourish us generously too.

In the **First Reading**, it is God himself who urgently pleads with his troubled, scattered people to listen. Through his prophet, he issues an invitation to a sacred meal. God offers 'water' for thirsty souls; 'corn, wine and milk' will also be made freely available for hungry hearts, without charge. In the **Psalm**, one traditionally sung at meals, we praise the God who cares for all his creatures, supplying them with nourishment.

Paul writes in very stirring language, assuring us of the ever-present love and power of Jesus Christ. Divine love gives us grace and encouragement to live life to the fullest, even with and through the unavoidable trials and sufferings of life. This is the Christian gospel, the Good News! (Second Reading)

Even whilst stricken with grief, Jesus's response to the people is one of compassion (**Gospel**). He heals the sick and feeds the hungry, and there is still plenty of food left over to share. Jesus feeds the crowd in a way that foresees the food and drink he will offer us in the Eucharist.

Let's pray this week for courage to take the risk of really hearing what God is saying to us; what sacred nourishment he is freely offering us. May we put ourselves into his hands, asking that he will deepen his life in us and in our anxious, unjust world.

#### Cautious Reopening of our Churches for public worship

It has been wonderful to open our churches for private prayer over the last few weeks and to be able to greet parishioners once again. Thank you to the volunteers that have offered to help at this time.

### Mass times and dates will largely depend on the availability of volunteers to Steward the Masses.

The number of people attending each mass will have to be limited, using the 1m+ guidelines, in order to retain social distancing. The numbers allowed will be posted at the entrance to each church. If you are a part of the same bubble at home then you will count as one.

If you are able to attend a midweek mass then please do so allowing those who can only

attend our weekend masses to do so.

**Before you arrive:** You should avoid bringing any unnecessary items into church, e.g. shopping bags, as you will not be returning to your seat once you have received Holy Communion.

#### When you arrive:

All persons attending a service in church must wear a face covering at all times.

- \* You will be welcomed by a volunteer steward and you may be asked to give your contact details.
- \* You will be directed to the hand sanitiser.
- \* You will be directed to a bench. It may not be where you usually sit.
- \* You must adhere to social distancing guidelines in place
- \* Any children accompanying you must do the same.
- \* Baskets will be available at the entrance (and exit) for your weekly envelopes or other contributions.

Toilets will remain closed at all times except for a genuine emergency.

<u>During Mass</u>: There will be no Sign of Peace. There will be no singing.

**Holy Communion:** Will be distributed after the final dismissal of the Mass.

- \* The words "The Body of Christ" and the reply "Amen" will only be said once at the beginning of distribution. They will not to be repeated for each person receiving Holy Communion.
- \* The volunteer stewards will direct you to approach the altar to receive Holy Communion.
- \* People receiving Communion will be instructed to approach the altar with their arms outstretched so as to maintain a reasonable distance from the minister.
- \* You may only receive the Sacred Host in your hand and not on your tongue.
- \* Communicants must avoid skin to skin contact with the minister's hands.
- \* You must then step to one side, lower your face covering and place the
- \* Sacred Host in your mouth then follow directions to leave the church immediately.

<u>After Mass</u> - Use only the designated exit. Please take home any newsletters, Mass sheets and other papers you may use. Please do not gather in the church porch or on church property for conversations. Continue to wear your face covering until you leave the area where other people are.
