

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time 9th August 2020

Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.'

- In the readings this week, Elijah and Jesus both seek out quiet places to pray alone. They reveal

an ever-present God who reaches out to us and brings peace, especially amidst the storms of our own lives.

The **First Reading** sees a dejected Elijah finding a place of solitude. There he recognizes and responds to God's still, small voice in the gentle breeze, rather than in the more dramatic events of wind, earthquake and fire. The **Psalmist** asks for the Lord's saving help as well as listening to his voice – one that speaks of justice and peace, mercy and faithfulness. In the **Second Reading**, St Paul shows his love for his fellow Jews, agonizing because most of them reject Christ. Paul is ready to be cut off entirely from Christ himself, if that would help his Jewish kinsfolk recognise Christ as their Lord.

The storm in Elijah's life is echoed by the storm in the **Gospel**. We see the disciples overcome their fears and doubts as they eventually recognize Jesus. Seeing the power of his presence, they proclaim their belief in who he is: 'Truly, you are the Son of God'.

The events of recent months may have made us more aware of God's presence in times of chaos. As we continue to move through these uncertain times, we pray for the grace always to be aware of God's presence in our lives, and confident in the peace he offers us.

Thank you to everyone who has acted as a steward. Mass times and dates largely depend on the availability of volunteers to Steward the Masses, so if you feel you could help then please contact Fr. Roy or Fr. Michael.

The number of people attending each mass will have to be limited, using the 1m+ guidelines, in order to retain social distancing. The numbers allowed will be posted at the entrance to each church. If you are a part of the same bubble at home then you will count as one.

If you are able to attend a midweek mass then please do so allowing those who can only attend our weekend masses to do so.

Before you arrive: You should avoid bringing any unnecessary items into church, e.g. shopping bags, as you will not be returning to your seat once you have received Holy Communion.

When you arrive:

All persons attending a service in church must wear a face covering at all times.

* You will be welcomed by a volunteer steward and you may be asked to give your contact details.

- * You will be directed to the hand sanitiser.
- \ast You will be directed to a bench. It may not be where you usually sit.
- * You must adhere to social distancing guidelines in place
- * Any children accompanying you must do the same.

* Baskets will be available at the entrance (and exit) for your weekly envelopes or other contributions.

Toilets will remain closed at all times except for a genuine emergency.

During Mass: There will be no Sign of Peace. There will be no singing.

Holy Communion: Will be distributed after the final dismissal of the Mass.

* The words "The Body of Christ" and the reply "Amen" will only be said once at the beginning of distribution. They will not to be repeated for each person receiving Holy Communion.

* The volunteer stewards will direct you to approach the altar to receive Holy Communion.

* People receiving Communion will be instructed to approach the altar with their arms outstretched so as to maintain a reasonable distance from the minister.

- * You may only receive the Sacred Host in your hand and not on your tongue.
- * Communicants must avoid skin to skin contact with the minister's hands.
- * You must then step to one side, lower your face covering and place the
- * Sacred Host in your mouth then follow directions to leave the church immediately.

<u>After Mass</u> - Use only the designated exit. Please take home any newsletters, Mass sheets and other papers you may use. Please do not gather in the church porch or on church property for conversations. Continue to wear your face covering until you leave the area where other people are.
