Our Sunday projects at the Park have continued with our loyal Sunday team. We have managed the glades, meadows and paths of the Park, checked our newly planted trees, and constructed dead hedges to create habitats. During July the organic hay was harvested from the meadows and made a very rural scene with the Wembley stadium arch as a background. The surveys have continued on birds, frogs, hay meadows, butterflies and moths. A new species – the grass vetchling was identified in the hay meadows. A Silver Washed Fritillary - a new butterfly for the Park - was also identified.

Our special thanks to our dedicated recorders and to Simon and Michael for organizing the tool collection (and the tea) each week.

We have continued the moth count at Fryent Country Park – our moth count has now reached 200 different species.
