Lockton & Levisham Heritage Group

Two members of the group recently visited the National Records Office at Kew to further research the 1941 Farm

Survey. We now have a list of farms and details of crops, livestock, equipment, etc, together with maps showing the locations of land associated with each farm. There were 31 farms in the parish totalling 4500 acres with 365 cattle, 2824 sheep, 3524 hens, 257 geese & ducks, 102 horses and 4 tractors (all 10/20HP Fordsons).

Diseased horsechestnut trees

Permission has now been granted for the felling of the horsechestnut tree by the sewage works near the top of the Howl. Both this work and the felling of the diseased tree opposite the cemetery will take place shortly.

Bus stop hardstandings

The Parish Council has paid £1000 for two hardstandings at the bus stops on the A169 at the lane end as NYCC would not carry out this work. So now we need George to get back to having trips to Whitby to make use of them!

Refurbishment of the well & new village seat

The listed building consent for the refurbishment of the stone wall at the well has now been granted. A LEADER grant from the North York Moors National Park has been awarded to cover the cost of the stonework and refurbishment of the railings at the well. The grant will also cover the cost of a new circular seat around the lime tree opposite the shop. David Stephenson will be carrying out the work on the railings and the circular seat.
