Lockton Mini Meadow



Mid March: the only flowers showing are a few lesser celandine. There's confusion about lesser celandine (*Ranunculus ficaria*) and greater celandine, *Chelidonium majus*. The name celandine is said to derive from chelidon, Greek for swallow, but celandine is

one of the very first flowers to appear, long before swallows return. It was Wordsworth's favourite flower. He wrote

'It is remarkable that this flower, coming out so early in the Spring as it does, and so bright and beautiful, and in such profusion, should not have been noticed earlier in English verse. What adds much to the interest that attaches



to it is its habit of shutting itself up and opening out according to the degree of light and temperature of the air.'

The carving on Wordsworth's monument in Grasmere is however not the lesser celandine but the greater. Gardeners are not keen on celandine because it spreads so easily with its knobbly tubers. This led to earlier names such as Figwurt or Pilewort. In his *Herball or Generall Historie of Plantes* (1597), Gerard wrote 'The later age use the rootes or graines for the piles, which being often bathed with the juice mixed with wine, or with the sick man's urine, are drawne togither and dried up, and the paine quite taken away.'

St Giles Church

Dear Friends,

April marks - weather permitting - Spring. It is also the end of the Church's penitential season of Lent, which leads into Palm Sunday on 9th April, when we recall Jesus riding a donkey into Jerusalem, thronged with

cheering crowds, but which turns into the tragedy of Good Friday, and results in the glorious Resurrection on Easter Day.

Should you wish to attend a Palm Sunday service, then at **Pickering** the service starts with a procession, leaving the Parish Hall on Hallgarth at 10am and into church. It's always a joyous occasion, with much singing and crowds attracted, though the service in church begins to move towards the events of Jesus' arrest, torture and death, and Holy Week begins. More details on the website www.pickeringchurch.com. Again, at Pickering, Maundy Thursday's service is powerful and moving: it begins at 7.30pm on 13th April. Good Friday 14th April consists of two parts: a series of meditations based on specific places in Jerusalem connected with Jesus' torture and death, which is from 12-1.30pm; then from 1.45-3pm, the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday, which is another powerful service helping take us deeper into events of that day, almost two thousand years ago.

Lockton's Parish Church will hold its Easter Day service at 10.30am, on Sunday 16th April.

Other services at Lockton in May will be at 10.30am: Sundays 14th and 28th May.

I do wish to draw to your attention that it will be Lockton's Annual Parochial Church Meeting, in the Village Hall, starting at **7.30pm** on **Thursday 6th April**. This is an important annual meeting at which members of the Parochial Church Council are elected and parish church business discussed.

I also know that many of you will be sad to hear that our curate, **Fr Christopher Johnson**, is leaving. Curates only have a four year contract, so we knew he would have to leave this year, but we will all be sorry to see him go. Fr Christopher is to become Vicar of Horbury, near Wakefield, in the old West Riding. His final service will be at Pickering, at 10am on Sunday 23rd April. Do come and say farewell to him, and wish him well for his future.
