more extracts to fill up the column inches.

### Newspaper extracts

Malton Messenger

31 Dec 1892

*Advert for the sale of High House Farm:*

*-good farm house & buildings & 47 acres.*

*Also enclosed moor of 35 acres.*

*- 24 arable and 6 acres grass adjacent to the dwelling house, the rest on the west of David Lane.*

*- good sporting district for all kinds of game.*

14 Jan 1893

*Sale of High House Farm at George Hotel, Pickering.*

*The bidding was brisk from £500 to £940 (for Mr T J Mintoft), Mr Boulton bid £10 more and the lot was knocked down to him. (the purchase was for W Cooper of Sinnington)*

18 Mar 1893

*Lockton Primitive Methodists just had a very successful chapel anniversary service. On Saturday evening Rev Cuckwell? Gave a young peoples' entertainment – lantern pictures of Cinderella, Uncle Tom's Cabin and Robinson Crusoe.*

*On Monday evening the reverend gentleman lectured on London and again brought his lantern.*

*There was a large audience. Thanks to the School Board for the use of the room.*

### Extract from Lockton School logbook:

1898

*Feb 1. Taken off register, names of*

*- Alfred Robinson – becomes an apprentice to the grocery trade*

*- Edgar Johnson – to be hired as a farm servant.*

*Feb 15. Gave Magic Lantern Entertainment to children and parents. Proceeds to be devoted to School Library Fund.*

*Feb 16. Repeated the entertainment at Levisham School.*

## Parish Council news

### Dog fouling

We have some complaints about dog fouling in the village and also of a dog running loose in gardens. Please keep your dogs under control and clean up after them.

### Precept

We have had to increase the precept this year after keeping the rate unchanged for several years. We have had a sharp decrease in the interest on our balance and the payment we receive from NYCC for grass cutting has also been decreased. Also we could face having to purchase grit for the bins in future years.

### Census

Census Day is on Sunday March 27<sup>th</sup>. Census questionnaires will start to be posted out from March 7<sup>th</sup>.

### Library Service

There is currently a consultation on the future of the NYCC library services. It is proposed that the mobile libraries will no longer run and 24 out of 42 libraries will close or become community libraries within the next 2 years. Pickering library is not one of the libraries due to close. Questionnaires can be completed either online from the NYCC website or forms are available at the library in Pickering.
