Fox & Rabbit Farm , judging commences at 1pm


Saturday July 23rd - Country Show & Sports


Lockton and Levisham Poetry and Prose House Group

No activity to report but I will continue with the newspaper extracts for the time being.

Newspaper extracts: Malton Messenger 15 August 1908

Lockton Annual Outing held on Friday 31st July for the children of Lockton Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist Chapels and State School with their teachers and a few friends. About 130 attended the outing, the place chosen was the pretty village of Thornton Dale. At 9 o'clock the party assembled and were soon loaded up in 6 wagons drawn by 12 beautifully decorated horses, which affected a charming sight. A start was made around 9-30am & Thornton Dale reached by 11am. The children were then taken to a field kindly lent by Mr Allenson where dinner was served. Afterwards games of cricket and ball etc were freely indulged in and the party availed themselves of the opportunity of looking round the village and going on short walks. In the evening a cricket match was held between Lockton and Thornton Dale boys. The visitors were victorious. Races were run for nuts and sweets and at 7pm preparations were made for home. Lockton was reached by 9pm after a most enjoyable days outing. The official of the State School thanked those who had sent the wagons.

Malton Messenger 26 June 1897

Queen's Jubilee. A procession of children sang and paraded the village. Addresses were given on the green. About 300 sat down to a free tea and 200 to a free supper. There were sports in the evening. The children also had tea the following evening. The Jubilee Fund raised £12-11s-0d

Lockton Mini Meadow



Apart from one single bluebell (native, not
Spanish, how did it get there?) most of the
meadow's flowers in May are yellow cowslips
and buttercups. The taller buttercups are *Ra-
nunculus acris*. They continue flowering
throughout the summer. The shorter, extremely hairy but-
tercups are *Ranunculus bulbosus*. They flower from
March to June. The position of the sepals under the petals
is quite distinctive. No sign as yet of the annoyingly prolific
creeping buttercup *Ranunculus repens*.



Physicists have come up with an
intriguing explanation of the cus-
tom of holding a buttercup un-
der the chin to see if you like
butter (google buttercups Cam-
bridge physicist). The petals
have a carotenoid pig-
ment which absorbs light in the
blue and green region of the op-
tical spectrum. The result is that
the other colours - in this case,
mostly yellow - are reflected
back. Light passes through the
epidermal layers of the petals, a
layer of flat cells which reflect

light. In the buttercup this layer has not one but two ex-
tremely flat surfaces, effectively doubling the gloss of the
petal. The petals are also good at reflecting ultraviolet
light, which could explain how the buttercup uses its epi-
dermal layers to attract insects.

All *Ranunculus* species are poisonous when eaten fresh
by livestock, but their acrid taste and blistering of the
mouth means they are left alone. The toxins are degraded
by drying, so hay is safe.
