12.1 Government shale gas exploration and production planning consultations – consultation closes 25 October 2018.

We are informed that the Government has expressed the intention (link 1 below) to make exploratory shale gas well pads a Permitted Development Right (typically used hitherto for minor home extensions and temporary small construction) thus obviating the requirement for planning permission and (link 2 below) to bring shale gas production into the National Strategic Infrastructure Project regime, so removing planning applications from local control at county level to a central government departmental inspectorate, leading to the compulsory acquisition of land.
