Chairman's Notes

I am sorry to announce that the 25th August coach ramble has been cancelled. A pre-walk carried out in May unexpectedly highlighted a potential safety issue where the planned route crossed the busy A12 at Woodbridge. To sidestep this problem would have entailed a long detour and rather spoilt the walk.

To replace the coach trip I am planning an away day to Dover. Departure will be from Stratford International railway station. A day return costs £39, less 1/3rd for those people with a valid senior rail card. Train travel is direct with no changes on route. Individuals will be responsible for purchasing their own tickets. There is no planned walk at Dover although it is intended to walk up the hill passed the castle and on to the Downs. Please see the programme for further details.

Now the good news. Metro services to Liverpool Street station have now been taken over by Crossrail which is part of TfL. This means Freedom passes are valid before 9.30. Walk leaders now have the option to start their London walks earlier if they so wish.

Coral and I have been directly involved in organizing coach rambles for a number of years and have decided to take a break. The committee is now actively looking for volunteers to take over the planning and organizing of our future coach outings. If you are mindful to have a go please speak to either Coral or myself where help and advice will be freely available.



Something to look forward to we are planning to hold our Christmas Lunch at the Olde Plough on the 22nd December. More information will be available in the December programme.

Are you Moderate or Leisurely walk leader?

A bit of a cryptic Title, but all will become apparent. Walks, when put on 'walkfinder' are graded in terms of their difficulty. There are 6 grades, fully described on the Ramblers web site, here is a

For most of our walks the first two and last two would not be appropriate.

Which leaves :-

Leisurely - walks for reasonably fit people with at least a little country walking experience. May include unsurfaced rural paths. Walking boots and warm, waterproof clothing are recommended.

Moderate - walks for people with country walking experience and a good level of fitness. May include some steep paths and open country, and may be at a brisk pace. Walking boots and warm, waterproof clothing are essential - See more at: <http://www.ramblers.org.uk/go-walking/about-group-walks/walks-difficulty.aspx#sthash.H4vvePwY.dpuf>

The main difference is that certain equipment is required for a moderate walk, but recommended for a Leisurely walk. Moderate walks may be at a brisk pace.

Our default position is 'Leisurely' whilst some other groups default to 'Moderate'. Unless you notify otherwise walks will continue to be graded leisurely. If you have walks on the current programme you think should be 'Moderate', please let me know.

We have been informed by Ramblers Head Office that we need to comply with the Disability Equality Act (2010).

We will continue to let Walks Leaders decide whether it is appropriate to allow dogs to participate in their walks, but even in cases where it is decided not to allow dogs to participate in a particular walk, we must allow registered assistance dogs to participate with their owners e.g. guide, hearing, service, therapy and seizure alert dogs.

As a general rule only “Registered Assistance Dogs” will be allowed on walks unless the Walks Leader specifies that dogs are welcome.

*I am intending to put
the whole of the London Loop on
the programme.*

*It is a 140 mile walk in the Green
Belt surrounding London and is
affectionately known as the M25
for walkers. It goes past some very
notable buildings ie Hall Place*

used as a receiving station during the 2nd World War, for encoded messages for Bletchley Park and Holwood House, the venue for the debate on the abolition of the Slave Trade. We will go through some beautiful countryside including Jubilee Park in Petts Wood, Kent which has a memorial stone to William Willett campaigner for Daylight Saving aka British Summer Time.

I will be doing it in easy to manage stages of between 7 ½ and 11 miles with one 13 ¾ mile section which I may be able to break into two smaller sections nearer the time. As some of it will require using the Dartford Bridge I would prefer people to contact me if they intend to come on the walk. A few people (myself and my partner) already have a Dart Account therefore it makes sense to only use a few cars. As the walks are linear we may need to use public transport to get back to the start or leave a car at the end of the walk as we did when I did the Thames Path. This will depend on numbers and how easy it is to get a transport link back. I really hope people will be able to join me on what should be a fantastic journey.
