

Dear Member, July 2019

Your Committee last met on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2019, the meeting was chaired by Norman Dixon and all Officers and Members, except two attending. Officers gave reports to the Committee who discussed related topics, giving concluding decisions as required. Here are the main issues discussed.

- The Committee was again pleased to learn that the Club was in a good financial state.
- A board requesting leaders for the November to April rambles has been circulated round the coach; with a good response.
- Discussion was held about the re-instatement of the time of coach departure from Clarence Street. An announcement will be made on the coach with a requested 'show of hands' to indicate member's preference, prior to a committee decision.
- The Autumn Weekend at the Shearings Hotel at Great Yarmouth on the weekend of 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> November 2019 has attracted 22 members to date...
- The Spring Weekend at the HF House at Monk Coniston on 27<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> March 2020 has attracted 39 people confirming to attend. - The Committee was advised again that membership continues to thrive with currently 114 ordinary members, which includes 6 Honorary members.
- There is a full diary of social events for this year's winter. It was agreed that there will

  where members are requested to introduce their favourite piece of music, poem etc.,
  Peter Little will host the evening.
