COACHING SUB-COMMITTEE

Whilst our coaching activities during the indoor season haVE been introducing new bowlers to adapting to our indoor 60ft mats, we have been busy preparing our coaching stocks for the new outdoor season. This has involved clearly marking the woods storage boxes and packaging and sorting our stock of bowling shoes. Whilst we can cover most foot sizes we are short of the larger sizes especially from size 10 up to size 12. All coaching equipment is housed in the outside cabinets. As these cupboards are not secured by a combination lock, provision for a key combination safe to store the access key would be appreciated and we suggest this be positioned inside the pavilion rather than in close proximity to the storage cupboards. Regular changes to the combination on the key safe (if provided) would be undertaken to ensure that the coaching staff have control over the persons who can have access to the cupboards.

We are grateful that a grant of £500 has been offered by Winchester City Council for the purchase of equipment to assist introducing members of the public to the game of lawn bowls. In this respect as coaches we have considered the best use of such funding and wish to propose that the following items be purchased prior to our Public Open Day in April:

1 set of Drakes Pride Professional size 000 Coaching woods. (RRP £235)

1 set of Drakes Pride Professional size 0000 Coaching woods. (RRP £235)

6 x Drakes Pride Telescopic Jack Setters (RRP £19.95 each) - see below for description.

Whilst the above items would normally retail for a total price of £589.50 John has negotiated with Bowls Direct the whole package for £500, a saving of £89.50.

This price is subject to the woods being engraved "Coaching" (this is a condition by the manufacturers). We currently have 2 sets of woods with similar engravings. Such markings provide a deterrent to theft.

The Drakes Pride Telescopic Jack Setters are of a different design to those used at "Hedge End" but we consider them more practical in AS much as they can be reduced in size for skips to carry from one end to the other rather than having jack setters at each end of the rink. Also they would be easier to store, in the current green equipment boxes.



The alternative (See above photo) is the "Easy Jack" jack setter which is currently used by Hedge End. These retail via Amazon at £13.99 each. Total cost for 12 would be £167.88. This would provide for 2 per rink.

The Drakes Pride Jack Set is extremely lightweight, compact and portable – so much so it will fold away and slip into a pocket. There's now no need to crouch or bend during play. It can be fully extended in seconds for immediate use.

Designed and manufactured in the UK it's extremely robust all metal construction is finished with a highly comfortable soft grip handle.

Should the Management committee prefer the Easy Jack setter then Bowls Direct would charge £400 for the 2 sets of coaching woods which still gives a saving of £70 over the RRP.

Bowls Direct have indicated that there is currently a 10 week delay in delivery woods from Drakes Pride so we would need to place our order ASAP to ensure that they can be delivered by them on Green Opening Day (saving postage).

Last year there was an opportunity of some funding from the Fords Trust and should funds still be available from this source we would like to suggest the purchase of 2 sets of Junior woods to enable Grandparents to introduce their grandchildren to bowls. We currently have 2 sets of Junior woods which have not been over used and, therefore, the provision of further sets is not considered a priority at present.

Last outdoor season saw the introduction of green equipment boxes containing measuring equipment which were assembled by Chris Robinson. These have been popular and are often the envy of visiting clubs. More sets are available to be purchased should funds be available.

This year's Public Open Day will take place on Saturday 25th April 2020 when we hope to enrol a new intake for our Beginners Courses which are planned to run on Monday and Wednesday Evenings throughout May.
