PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The February PC meeting was especially busy with various groups wishing to raise matters with the council.

Bright Sparks: Three members of an organisation called 'Bright Sparks' made a presentation to Council on the background and objectives of their organisation, which aims to assist small businesses and individuals to flourish. There is more information about them elsewhere in this newsletter.

Grants to Village Organisations: Representatives of the Memorial Hall committee sought financial help from Council to help replace the guttering around the Memorial Hall. Council discussed a number of ways to help with this project and proposed to underwrite it to a maximum of £1,860.

Council News: Two residents had applied for the vacancies which had been advertised. Following short presentations from each resident and a discussion by council it was decided to co-opt both Linda Granger and Katrina Lancaster as new members of Council. Congratulations to both these new members. There is still one remaining vacancy on Council, so if you are interested in helping to manage the council's property and finances and can spare one evening per month, then please contact the parish clerk, Steve Lawless, on 620329.

Financial Planning: A decision was taken by Council in November 2011 not to apply for a precept increase this year. Since that time some factors have changed, and concern had been expressed over a recent communication that changes to the precept might be capped by central government in future years. Such a cap could have a negative impact on Council's efforts to smooth precept changes and avoid dramatic swings - either up or down - which have happened in earlier years. Council took this opportunity to have a fresh look at the November decision, bearing in mind also the number of village organisations now asking for financial help. Following February Council a meeting of the Finance committee was held, followed by a special council meeting. It was decided that the November precept decision should stand, and a rolling 5 year financial plan developed, with regular reviews to assist planning and provide stability for the whole process.

Localism Bill: Further background work was planned to enable council to understand the implications of the new Localism Bill & Neighbourhood Planning. Training of councillors progresses and a small group of councillors were asked to propose how best to take this matter forward.

Probation Service: The Probation Service has now completed two of the three agreed projects (cleaning the Brook and decorating the Youth Club). It is expected that they will start the third project (clearing undergrowth from popular footpaths) sometime after Easter.

Dog Fouling: Concern was again raised about the amount of dog fouling around the village. Council has proposed some action to help reduce this problem near Soft Water Lane.

Footpaths: DCC has issued instructions to replace the broken handrail and repair the footpaths from Brookside up the

Yeld and will place specific popular footpaths on the annual clearance list. Further meetings will take place regarding the footpaths up to Bradwell Edge.

BRADWELL INFANTS SCHOOL

Alastair, Bishop of Derby recently joined the families of the school in St. Barnabas Church for their Sharing Bread Service. The celebration was a very child-friendly introduction to the Eucharist, led by Reverend an Davis. The children played a central role, leading their own prayers and responses. BRADWELL JUNIOR SCHOOL



Year 6 pupils at Bradwell Junior School have successfully completed the British Heart Foundation Emergency course. Working with Teaching Assistant Mrs Wain, the children received training in many areas of first aid including CPR, serious bleeding and dealing with an unconscious casualty. Pupil Eve Seymour (pictured) said, "I found the HeartStart training very useful. I now feel that if someone was involved in an emergency, such as suffering a heart attack, I would have the skills to help them and would know what order to do things in. My favourite part of the training was learning the recovery position as we watched a video and then got to do it ourselves. To me, the lessons were a great success!"

Head Teacher Mrs Attwood said, "This is a new venture for the school and we are committed to providing this training on an annual basis for each Y6 group. We see this as part of our continuing work to provide opportunities for the children to develop valuable life skills."

DISTRICT COUNCIL

I now represent the District Council, not parishes, on the Peak Park Board. There will be an election for my replacement as parishes' representative. However, I am still available to help anyone with Peak Park enquiries and my email address is – chris.furness@peakdistrict.gov.uk. As I reported in the Dec Newsletter, the toilets will re-open at Easter. However, they are currently designated for seasonal opening only – so they will be closed again in Oct for six months. District officers plan to repair and refurbish them with new hand-driers, light fittings and wall tiling and to steam clean and re-paint them. Hopefully this work will be completed before the Easter re-opening. Bradwell Parish Council has declined a proposal from District for the PC to be responsible for the cost of keeping them open over the autumn/winter. I will be arguing, at District Council meetings, that since the toilets are mostly used by visitors to Bradwell, District should meet the whole cost of keeping them open all year round.
